#### **Important Terms**

- <u>Semester</u> One-half of the school year (18 weeks)
- <u>Credit</u> Transcript unit is earned each semester (with a passing grade (A, B, C, D).
- <u>Elective</u> A course you choose because of your personal or career interests.
