Important Terms

- <u>Required/Core Class</u> A class you have to take and pass to be able to graduate
- <u>Elective</u> A course you choose because of your personal or career interests.
- <u>Honors</u> Advanced curriculum.
- <u>Advanced Placement (AP)</u> Courses with college-level curriculum and the potential to earn college credit.

Graduation Requirements

8 credits in English Language Arts 6 credits in Mathematics 4 credits in Sciences (2 Physical Science; 2 Biology) 1 credit in Health 7 credits in Physical Education 2 credits in U.S. History 1 credit in Economics 1 credit in Civics

Students receive one credit per semester for each course successfully completed.

Graduation vs. College Requirements

| Subject Area | U-46 Requirement | Four Year College |
|------------------|------------------|---|
| English | 4 years | 4 Years |
| Mathematics | 3 Years | 4 Years |
| Science | 2 Years | 3 or 4 Years* |
| Social Studies | 2 Years | 3 or 4 Years* |
| Foreign Language | No requirement | 2 to 4 Years of same language |

For **highly competitive colleges** we suggest 4 years in each of the curricular areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language.

Requirements for college admission vary from school to school so the information presented above is intended to be used as a guide. Specific questions about college admission requirements should be directed to the college or university.
