School and Community Profile

South Elgin High School is one of the five high schools in School District U-46, the second largest school district in the state of Illinois. U-46 encompasses ninety square miles in Kane, Cook and DuPage counties. Students reside in the communities of South Elgin, Bartlett, Elgin, Wayne, West Chicago and Streamwood. Student enrollment for the 2022-23 school year is 2837 students. The ethnic composition of the student body is as follows: 41% Caucasian, 37% Hispanic, 11% Asian, 5% African American, 5% multi-racial, 0.6% Native American, and less than 0.4% Hawaiian/Pacific Islander. 35% of all students qualify for free or reduced lunch. South Elgin High School opened on August 24, 2005 and graduated its first class in 2008. South Elgin High School is accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education and by the Higher Learning Commission.

South Elgin High School offers over 200 courses in order to challenge each student to achieve his/her potential. Courses are offered at varying levels, including 31 Honors and 26 Advanced Placement courses. South Elgin supports an open access district policy for honors and AP courses.

The district offers a K-12 dual language program for students incorporating all curricular areas. As a culmination of this program, students may qualify for the Illinois State Seal of Biliteracy.

The Beacon Academy is a selective four year program open to all district students which specializes in digital and media arts. Beacon is a Certified National Demonstration Magnet School through 2025.

School District U-46 and Elgin Community College District 509 have partnered to offer dual credit classes to qualified juniors and seniors. Individual courses are offered at SEHS or students can elect to enroll in a full-time, two-year program culminating in an Associates Degree.

Extra Curricular Activities

South Elgin offers a comprehensive interscholastic athletic program consisting of 31 sports for both boys and girls with multiple levels of competition. South Elgin also offers over 50 clubs and organizations for student participation each year and has very strong and active participation in IHSA competitive programs and vocational competitions. With over two-thirds of the student body participating in extra-curricular activities, our students are clearly working to expand the "Storm Nation".

Response to Covid-19

COVID-19 shifted U-46 to all online from March 2020 to March 2021. From March to May 2021, instruction was delivered concurrently via Zoom with approximately 48% of students opting for in person. For 2nd semester of the 2019-20 school year, NC (no credit) was issued for incomplete coursework. During the 2020-21 school year, students were able to recover first semester credit after earning second semester credit in some yearlong classes.
