From the Principal's Desk

Storm Families,

Our second semester progress reports will be entered by Friday, March 22nd. You'll be able to view your student's grade via the parent portal at that time. Report cards will be mailed home on Friday, March 29th. Listed below is the testing schedule for the remainder of the semester:

• **The Illinois Science Assessment** (ISA) is a test given to all students enrolled in Biology. The testing window is from March 4th – March 15th. We're working with the Biology staff to develop a schedule and we will communicate that to students and parents once finalized.

• **SAT Testing** for all Juniors will be Tuesday, April 9th. This is the College Entrance Test that Illinois will give to all Juniors this day. We will offer a SAT makeup test on Tuesday, April 23rd for any students absent on April 9th. Sitting for this test will be a requirement for graduation. Freshmen and sophomores will be in attendance this day and be in testing as well. Tuesday, April 9th will be a non-attendance day for Seniors. All freshmen, sophomore, and junior students will report to their testing locations first thing in the morning and will be dismissed following testing. Dismissal will be around 12:30pm. Students needing busing can remain at school in the commons area until 2:55 and then catch their bus. More information will be shared as this date approaches. I just wanted to put it on your radar now.

• **AP Testing** will run from May 6th – May 17th. Registration for AP testing will begin on Monday, March 4th and run through Friday, March 15th. Students can register for AP tests in the Guidance Office. There will be a separate email sent over the weekend with more specifics and costs. This year we plan on administering over 1000 AP tests! Students and staff have been working hard in preparation for these tests.

Seal of Biliteracy

The Illinois State Seal of Biliteracy is an award bestowed by the Illinois State Board of Education in recognition and celebration of students who have attained a high level of proficiency in two or more languages before high school graduation.

How does a student earn the Seal of Biliteracy?

To qualify, students must achieve a proficiency score in English and another language:

1. English Proficiency - 540 or higher on the English Language Arts portion of the SAT, or 21 composite score or 18 on the English test of the ACT, or a 4.8 or higher on the ACESS test (only if taken while enrolled in high school).

2. Language Proficiency – Intermediate 5/high or higher on all sections of the language test for the Seal. (A commendation can be earned with Intermediate 1-4/low.)

How does a student sign-up for testing?

Registration is now open for the language testing for <u>Illinois State Seal of Biliteracy</u>. The test has four domains in reading, speaking, listening, and writing and is free to U-46 students. To earn the Seal of Biliteracy, high school students must demonstrate proficiency in both the target language and English (usually assessed through the SAT or ACCESS test). The languages the District can test include Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hindi, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, and Thai. Being bilingual could earn students two years of foreign language credit at an Illinois public university! Students are permitted to take the test multiple times. It is offered every fall and spring. For this spring's testing, students must <u>sign up here</u> **before March 6** to register for the language test. Testing times and locations will be communicated to students via email prior to March 8th. Please contact <u>carriecrowe@u-46.org</u> if you have any questions.

From the Dean's Office

Attention all juniors and seniors planning on attending Prom this year- You cannot be on LOP (Loss of Privilege) for excessive tardies (15 or more) nor can you be on LOP for exceeding the 90% attendance policy. You must be below 17.4 days absent in order to stay off LOP. If you think you are in danger of that please see your Dean as soon as possible.

Attention seniors - Just a reminder that you cannot be on LOP for excessive tardies or for exceeding the 90% attendance policy if you also want to attend the senior boat trip, the Grad night event at Great America, or the graduation ceremony. See your Dean if you are in danger of being and remaining on the LOP list.

Dress Code - No hats and/or headgear are allowed (cannot wear, carry, or clip to waistline) during the school day. Hoodies cannot be worn on the head. Clothing that is considered revealing will not be allowed.

Student Parking

- Due to the nature of how the parking lot has been plowed, some student parking spots are blocked. <u>Please do not park in</u> <u>another numbered spot</u>. Come to the Dean's office to be redirected to another non-numbered area in the lot before school. If you do not report the information to the Dean's office, you risk receiving a \$25 ticket.
- Parking Permits *must be visibly displayed*, hung from the rear view mirror *facing out* while the vehicle is parked in the lot.
- Students must park in their assigned parking spot.
- **NOTE:** Students are <u>NOT</u> allowed to park on campus until they have submitted a complete parking application, which is also approved by the Deans' Office. *Students who park on campus without an approved application will be subject to having their vehicle towed from campus.*

Student Dismissal - For drivers who pick up their students after school, do not double park by the gym, or along the one-way drive at any point in front of the building. The drive must be kept open for busses to pick-up students and for emergency vehicles, should the need arise.

Student ID's - ID's on lanyards need be worn upon entering the building and while walking in the halls. This is for the safety of every student and staff in the building and on school grounds. Keep in mind each ID reprint is a \$5 cost to you. Students please find a routine and reliable way to store your ID overnight so you will not forget it. Thank You for wearing your ID!
