#### Storm Families,

Happy April! Hope everyone enjoyed the spring break spending time with family and friends. This week, students and staff appeared to be well rested and energized for the April/May stretch run. Graduation will be here before we know it!

Tuesday, April 9th will be a testing day for students in grades 9, 10, and 11. South Elgin High School will administer the School Day SAT for all juniors, which is a graduation requirement. Also, freshmen and sophomores will take a preliminary SAT (PSAT) test. Sophomores will take the PSAT 10, and freshmen will take the PSAT 8/9. Juniors, sophomores, and freshmen will test on Tuesday, April 9th, and need to arrive on campus as normal on this date. Class of 2019 seniors will be excused from school on Tuesday, April 9th—because they are not testing, but have the opportunity to arrange and conduct off campus college visits, a job shadow experience, or complete community service hours on this day.

#### **School Day SAT & PSAT Test Day Checklist for Students**


- Students must bring acceptable photo identification (i.e. Illinois driver's license, Illinois state identification card, 18-19 school identification card). Students will *NOT be admitted* to test if their ID does not meet the testing requirements. Testing staff will check each student's photo ID, admit students to their assigned classroom, direct students to their assigned seat, and provide students with test materials.
- Students need to bring two sharpened soft lead No. 2 pencils with good erasers, as well as a pen with either blue or black ink.

#### **Recommendations**

- Students should get plenty of rest the evening before testing, so they will not be tired during their exam.
- Also, the Food and Nutrition Action Center notes that missing breakfast can cause visual problems and slow memory function, while eating a full breakfast leads to fewer errors and quicker figuring in number-related tests. Please encourage your student to eat a healthy breakfast before testing at home or in the school cafeteria.
- Research shows that exercise can increase brain function leading to better assessment scores.
- Bring an approved calculator to use on the math sections of your test.
- Lock and secure all personal electronic devices (ex. cell phones, smart watches, school issued Chromebook, or any other device) outside of the testing room, hallways, or restrooms on exam date. <u>Use of these</u> devices during testing will disqualify a student's score.

## News from the Nurse's Office

The school year is winding down! Be sure your child is ready for the new school year!

Senior Meningococcal vaccine requirement: Seniors must submit proof of having 2 meningitis vaccines, with the 2<sup>nd</sup> dose given after the 16<sup>th</sup> birthday (only 1 is needed if it was



given after the 16<sup>th</sup> birthday) on or before the first day of school, which is August 14th. Letters were mailed to the homes of all students who are not currently in compliance. **Students will not be able to complete registration, download schedules this summer or attend school in August until we have received the vaccine record.** Doctor's offices get very busy right before school starts. Please consider taking care of this requirement now and send us the vaccine record before the school year ends.

## From the Dean's Office

Be advised that all students caught vaping on school grounds or in possession of vaping paraphernalia will be issued a \$50.00 ticket from the South Elgin Police Department.

SEHS is not responsible for unsecured electronics that have been lost or stolen. Please remind your students to lock up their belongings.

**No Electronic Device Zone** - To better serve you, the Dean's office is now a "*no electronic device zone*." Phones, ear buds, tablets or any digital access devices are to be turned off and/or stowed away in your backpack before entering the Dean's office. You may make phone calls home using the phone located in the Dean's office. Thank you for you compliance!

**Attention seniors**: Just a reminder that you cannot be on LOP for excessive tardies or for exceeding the 90% attendance policy if you want to attend the senior boat trip, the Grad night event at Great America, or the graduation ceremony. See your Dean if you are in danger of the LOP list.

Student ID's – Current Student ID's with picture are to be worn on a lanyard during the school day. 



#### **HOSA – FUTURE HEALTH PROFESSIONALS**

SEHS HOSA students who qualified competed in the 2019 HOSA State Leadership Conference Competitions in Springfield, Illinois.

This year was the toughest year as far as number of competitors and the level of competition. Over 2000 students competed in the preliminary round and of those 900 were eliminated. Over 1100 students competed at state with over 40 schools competing. We had 83 students take part in the preliminary round with 60 qualifying for the State competition from which we sent 56 students.

Attached are the results of those who competed at state and placed in the top 10 in their respective competitions. Of those, 21 students placed in the top 3 in their competition and in doing so have qualified for the HOSA International Competition in Orlando, FL in June where over 10,000 students will be competing (http://ilc.hosa.org/)
