

MANDATORY GRADUATION REQUIREMENT FOR HIGH SCHOOL

In order to receive a diploma from an Illinois public high school, a student must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or if applicable, the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid. This is a result of the enactment of a new law, Public Act 101-0180. The purpose of the new law is to increase awareness about the resources available to help students with post-secondary education or training. Click here for FAFSA information.

News from Nurse's Office

Parents frequently have questions about school requirements and medications at school. <u>Click here</u> for FAQ's and answers related to health requirements and medication questions.

COVID CONCERNS AT SCHOOL

Please keep your child home from school and alert your building nurse if your student has one or more symptoms of COVID-19. Symptoms include:

- *Shortness of breath
- *New Cough
- *Sore throat *Vomiting
- *Fever (100.4 F or higher) *New onset of moderate/severe headache
- *Diarrhea *New loss of taste or smell
- *Fatigue from an unknown cause *Muscle or body aches from an unknown cause
- *Runny nose or congestion

- COVID, RSV, and Flu

Respiratory infections commonly occur during the fall and winter months as individuals spend more time indoors and are in closer contact with each other. This is commonly referred to as the "flu season." This year there is a concern with continued COVID-19 infections, active flu cases, and respiratory syncytial virus, commonly known as RSV. This has brought increased health concerns for children. National and local medical offices, immediate care centers, and emergency departments are seeing a significant increase in children with these illnesses-related visits by as much as 150 percent. Nationally, IDPH reports only 6 percent of pediatric ICU beds are available in the Chicagoland area. People infected with RSV usually show symptoms within 4 to 6 days after getting infected. Symptoms of RSV infection usually include:

- Runny nose
- Decrease in appetite
- Coughing
- Sneezing
- Fever
- Wheezing

These symptoms usually appear in stages and not all at once. In very young infants with RSV, the only symptoms may be irritability, decreased activity, and breathing difficulties. Almost all children will to have had an RSV infection by their second birthday.

NURSE'S OFFICE REMINDERS...

If your child is ill, please do not send them to school. If they are ill and come to the Nurses' Office with a fever, vomiting, or other significant symptoms (see COVID symptoms), they will be sent home. Please keep your contact information with phone numbers and emergency contacts updated in Infinite Campus. Any changes must be made through the Main Office.

Please have your child eat breakfast at home, or remind them to take advantage of the free breakfast at SEHS. Students who have not eaten in the morning frequently come to the Nurses' Office with lightheadedness or nausea. The Nurse' Office cannot provide snacks, and does not have food available. If the student continues to feel ill, you may be contacted to pick up the student from school.

The Nurses' Office does not stock over the counter medications for student use such as Tylenol, Ibuprofen, or Midol. Please refer to the frequently asked questions above regarding medication at school.

In addition, please complete & sign the appropriate <u>Course Selection Sheet</u> to bring to the school counselor appointment (select the sheet that corresponds to your grade level for the 23/24 school year). If there are any forms or applications you need to return back, please make sure to turn them in prior to winter break.

Seniors: Planning to attend Elgin Community College in the fall of 2023? Now is the time to apply! The ECC application is free, quick and easy. For information on applying as a new college student please visit elgin.edu and click the 'Apply Now' button on the top right-hand corner of the page. After filling out an application you will be prompted with next steps to ensure that you are registered and have early access to orientation dates.

If you are planning on **attending college** next Fall 2023 and will be applying for financial aid, then it is important to have the FAFSA filed as soon as possible. The earlier you file the better position you will be in to get the aid you are eligible for. Colleges will also use this document to determine what financial aid they can give. More info on FAFSA and the Financial aid process can be found using the following link: 2023-2024 FAFSA. **FAFSA** is a graduation requirement. If you are not planning on completing the FAFSA, click the link to complete the <u>FAFSA Nonparticipation</u> Form. Forms can be scanned and emailed back to Karen Lawson at <u>karenlawson@u-46.org</u> or dropped off to the SEHS Main Office.
