MANDATORY GRADUATION REQUIREMENT FOR HIGH SCHOOL

In order to receive a diploma from an Illinois public high school, a student must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or if applicable, the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid. This is a result of the enactment of a new law, Public Act 101-0180. The purpose of the new law is to increase awareness about the resources available to help students with post-secondary education or training. Click here for FAFSA information.

If a parent or guardian prefers not to complete the application, there is an opt-out waiver available. Click here for the opt-out waiver.

From the Office of Climate and Culture

As we prepare for extracurricular activities such as Prom and Senior Boat Trip, we want to ensure that our expectations of achieving high academic marks and regular school attendance are viewed as a priority. As such, students will be expected to adhere to the following expectations in order to participate in these privileged activities:

All students must be passing five academic courses at the time of sales and through the prom and/or boat trip dates.

Students not passing five academic courses may be placed on an academic contract with their dean. The expectation is that no failing grades are present on the day of the activity. If a course failure exists on the day, the student will not be allowed to attend and will receive a refund.

All students must maintain a 90% attendance rate for 2nd semester.

Cannot have 8 full days of unexcused absences or 64 single period absences.

Attendance office can only go back to the last 72 hours to excuse absences.

During the 4th quarter, a student may not receive an out-of-school suspension consequence.

A student may not be on the loss of privilege list.

IMPORTANT - "Senior Assassin game" is not a school sanctioned event. Any student partaking in the senior assassin game on school property including athletic fields, parking lot and in the school building, will be issued consequences.

EARLY RELEASE DAYS

Due to the high volume of early release calls, we will not be able to accommodate calls received after 1:00 pm on early release days unless deemed an emergency.

Attendance Reminders

- Single class absence or tardy that may have been entered in error can only be excused by the teacher for that period. Please email the teacher.
- 2. There is only a 72-hour window to excuse any absences.
- All students MUST scan in or out, when leaving early or arriving late. Failure to 3. do so will result in the student being marked unexcused for the periods missed.
- If there is an *in-school emergency* situation, please keep in mind that no calls will be answered until the situation is resolved.

Students leaving early

- When calling your student out early, please include the exact time of release, your name, relation to the student, your contact number, student's name and ID number.
- Be sure to call at least 2 hours before the release time.
- Your student will receive an early release pass that will be stamped "Report to Attendance Office" with the time they are to report to the attendance office. Your student must sign out at the attendance office in order to be excused. When signing out, your student will need to get their hand stamped to be able to return back to school if applicable. All students leaving early will exit using the main door (door #1) which is located near the security desk.
- If your student is returning to school (same day) your student will need to sign back in at the attendance office before going to class.
- Any student leaving during their lunch period for *a medical appointment* should provide a doctor's note.

Attention Parents, Guardians and Current 11th Grade Students in the Class of 2026:

All incoming seniors for the 2025-26 school year are required to provide proof of having received their second dose of the Meningococcal vaccine prior to the first day of school in August 2025 to be allowed to attend.

The first dose is normally received on or after the student's 11th birthday. The second dose is received at age 16 or older. If you receive annual physicals, there is a fair chance you may have already received this vaccine. If you do not have a copy of your most recent vaccine records, or if you are not sure if you already received the 2nd dose of the Meningococcal vaccine, please contact your primary care doctor. Please submit proof of having had this vaccine by the first day of school in August. If you have the records, or have gotten the vaccine this year, please send in the proof of vaccine as soon as possible to the SEHS school nurse's office.

Colleges will also use this document to determine what financial aid they can provide. Once you have completed your FAFSA you will be entered into our FAFSA raffle. All Juniors living in Illinois must take the School Day ACT assessment as part of the state graduation requirement. The ACT will be offered on April 15th. Any senior who did not take the school day SAT last April must take the ACT April 15th. Though this ACT is a required state test for juniors, the resulting scores are official ACT scores that can be reported to colleges during the application process, if you choose. 
