



We look forward to seeing you there and celebrating another fantastic year at South Elgin High School!





Attention to anyone submitting a Student Health Physicals and/or a Sport Physicals: The Health History portion *must* be completed. The questions need to be fully answered including allergies and medication, signed and date.

The 24-25 Student Health Physical has been updated. The Health History, which we refer to as the parent portion is now on the front page of the physical form. This section should be completed at the doctor's office and reviewed by the medical staff. For the Sports Physical, it is the first page front and back. According to the state, the physical is NOT COMPLETE without the health history portion being completed.

All incoming seniors for the 2024-25 school year are required to provide proof of having received their second dose of the Meningococcal vaccine *prior to the first day of school in August 2024* to be allowed to attend.

Stay focused, keep calm, and finish strong! Make sure you are checking Infinite Campus, checking Canvas, talking to your teachers, and completing your work/reassessments as needed. If you need extra help in a class, peer tutoring is available during all lunch periods in the Collaboration Center in the library.

ATTENTION SENIORS:

LAST REMINDER - FAFSA is a **graduation requirement**. If you have not completed this task yet, please make sure to get it done ASAP. This is a requirement in order to partake in the graduation ceremony.

All seniors have to complete either the 2024-2025 FAFSA or the 2024-2025 Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid (in <u>English</u> or <u>Spanish</u>) for any undocumented students. Colleges will also use this document to determine what financial aid they can provide. Any student/family that does not plan on completing the FAFSA or the Alternative Application will need to "opt-out" by completing the <u>FAFSA</u> Nonparticipation Form.

To complete the Senior Survey and Final Transcript Request please follow the steps below:

- 1. Login to Schoolinks through Clever
- 2. Click on show remaining To Dos on dashboard
- 3. Click on Senior Year-End Activity
- 4. Click on U-46 Post Secondary Evidence Plan
- Upload evidence of your post high school plans. (Examples: acceptance letter, housing deposit, employment offer letter, placement test results, enrollment confirmation, enlistment contract or work schedule).
