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Overview of South Elgin HS Summer Reading



Students at SEHS participate in a comprehensive reading program in their English courses in which they select their own novels to read during the year. Research suggests that consistent reading develops critical thinking and strengthens writing skills in students. Incidentally, when developing readers do not read over the summer months, they can lose up to an entire grade level of reading ability. Furthermore, reading a book that interests you can be fun! For this summer, South Elgin would like to highlight the psychological and educational benefits of reading, but we would also like to emphasize the joy that reading a book can bring. Below, you will find a list of summer reading suggestions. You are also welcome to choose your own book that is at an appropriate reading level for you. Books on these lists have been selected from recommendations made by staff, students, and librarians. Student interests and reading levels vary widely, therefore titles chosen may be found in both Young Adult and Adult sections of libraries and bookstores. Parents who have specific concerns about the content of selected titles are encouraged to read independent reviews. Most library catalogs provide links to professional review sources. Additionally, students and parents might consider reading a book together and discussing the characters, plot, and themes.
