

The revised units focus on fostering a love of learning while building literacy, critical thinking, and character.


These units integrate reading, writing, and research, emphasizing deep engagement with complex texts, collaborative learning, and student-centered inquiry.



- → New Units of Instruction including Common Assessments
- Foundational Literacy Instructional Guidance and Resources
- → Common Text Readings
- Inclusion of Keyboarding
- → Inclusion of Handwriting and Cursive

### Integrated Curriculum Guiding Principles

### → Focus on Big Ideas and Essential Questions

- ◆ Frame units around open-ended, thought-provoking questions that encourage inquiry and exploration.
- Use authentic tasks and challenges that connect classroom learning to students' communities and the wider world.

### → Align with Standards

- Use backward design: Start with learning goals and desired outcomes, then plan lessons and activities.
- ◆ Incorporate activities that build collaboration, empathy, and communication skills.

### → Promote Interdisciplinary Connections

- Highlight natural overlaps between subjects
- Use real-world contexts to show how skills and knowledge across disciplines work together.

### → Foster Student-Centered Learning

- ◆ Build opportunities for choice, voice, and self-direction.
- ◆ Include project-based learning (PBL), experiments, collaborative group work, and virtual field trips.

## Summary of New Units

### **Social Justice**

Develops crucial life skills like empathy, critical thinking, and respect for diversity, allowing them to recognize and challenge bias and injustice.

### **History**

Extend the exploration of key historical themes such as change, conflict, and citizenship, students learn critical thinking, develop empathy, and grasp cause-and-effect relationships.

### **Informational and Media Literacy**

Enable students to understand, analyze, and synthesize facts from various sources, fostering problem-solving and research skills to prepare students to thrive in a knowledge-based society, empowering them to become informed, critical thinkers and responsible digital citizens.
