III. New Business

The meeting opened with a reminder that next month's meeting will be asynchronous. The format will include reviewing curriculum proposals through a video and slides, followed by feedback submission via a structured Google form. The process will be refined based on committee feedback.

A. Budget Update

Committee members were reminded to complete the minutes approval and budget approval form. The approval of individual applications remains paused while a financial audit is conducted. Some discrepancies were found in previous approvals, requiring a thorough review before finalizing available funds. A complete update on application parameters will be shared in March.

A **soft rollout** of new curriculum and assessments will take place in 2025-26, with full implementation in 2026-27.

New instructional resources have been selected, focusing on inquiry-based learning and Spanish-language accessibility.

Common assessments will be introduced across all units.

Required PD will include training on resource use and assessment implementation, with optional asynchronous learning opportunities.

Teachers are encouraged to provide feedback on how asynchronous PD

HS World Language - Spanish (Not Heritage / AP or DL) / German / French



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Adoption of a **new Wayside Publishing resource** for Spanish, French, and German.

Teachers will receive \$500 for classroom libraries and \$1,200 over six years for cultural experiences, allowing for field trips, guest speakers, and other cultural enrichment activities.

Transition of fourth-year courses to **AP-level courses in 2026-27**, with an alternative non-AP option for Spanish.

PD opportunities include **AP Summer Institutes**, **resource training**, **and guidance on using cultural funds**.

3. MS Electives

New elective structure aligns with magnet academies and career pathways, offering diverse experiences for students.

Sixth and seventh graders will choose from **nine-week elective rotations**, intentionally mixing different subjects to expose students to new interests.

Seventh and eighth graders will have access to semester-long electives, including new courses in medical sciences, business, and performing arts.

Professional learning for elective teachers will be **offered on district PD** days, during summer, after school, or through pull-out training.
