

Thank you for all your support and encouragement during this testing time. Our 3rd - 6th grade students have been doing a wonderful job doing their best on their tests. Please continue to encourage them to show what they know and remind them that testing is just one part of their education and just one way we help measure their strengths and areas of improvement.

This also brings to mind our Key of Excellence that we are practicing this month: the key of Balance. Ask your child if they have discussed this key in class. Grade of the Month-Sixth Grade



Sixth grade students are in the midst of PARCC testing. After the first couple tests, students are reporting that they feel prepared for the kinds of questions asked. The work that we do all year long in reading, writing, and math makes them ready for the expectations of the test.

In reading, we are wrapping up our study of water pollution and it's affect on nature as we read World Without Fish and Flush, and connected the ideas in informational text and literature. Much of our focus was on point of view and

perspective - always finding evidence in the text to support it. We will wrap our year with a taste of Shakespeare - using reader's theater to make it more accessible to students.

We are writing informational books about activism topics such as child labor, bullying, pet abandonment, environments, and education. Students are using research skills to support the writing. These books will eventually take on a digital form using technology tools. Google Drive has been a wonderful technology support in all our writing projects this year!

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Shawn Godke Kathryn Tornero Our math lessons continue to focus on expressions and equations and how they can be used to solve real-life math problems. Using variables and coefficients, as well as writing and evaluating expressions, is a new skill in 6th grade.

We are also starting to plan for the end of sixth grade activities like the Kane County Cougars game and Sixth Grade Recognition. It's hard to believe that those events are right around the corner. What a great time to reflect on all the learning that we have done together this year!


