Who are we?

The DREAM Academy/New Beginnings Program is an alternative educational program which encompasses 14 different alternative programs at School District U-46. The purpose of the new setting is to give students an educational option to maximize their individual potential.

The DREAM Academy/New Beginnings Program provides a small school environment, featuring smaller class sizes in a structured setting with a student-centered curriculum. Semester classes with a blended curriculum include small group instruction and online curriculum.

Students must be referred to the DREAM Academy/New Beginnings
Program from the comprehensive schools in the District. Students are selected to attend The DREAM Academy/New Beginnings Program for a variety of reasons, such as: social, emotional, and academic reasons that have made it difficult for them to learn in the traditional school environment.

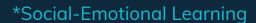

SAIL is a daily advisory time where teachers and students participate in activities that empower our students to become self-advocates and to work on life-long skills that will be useful within college or work settings.





Our Request

This proposal serves to request funding for the School Connect resource for DREAM Academy in order to supplement our SAIL courses which provide social-emotional and academic learning to all students enrolled in a DREAM Academy program.





Rationale

DREAM Academy uniquely offers a Social-Emotional Learning class for all students. In this course, the students participate in SEL Activities and Academic Learning opportunities.

The materials that have been used in the past are all created by the MTSS Lead.

- During school year 2020-2021, we piloted the digital version of the School Connect curriculum.

 - U-46's SEL initiatives
 - U-46's Post-Secondary initiatives
 - The 5 competencies of CASEL (Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning) which is a guiding resource for MTSS and SEL.



Description

Mission Statement: School Connect seeks to foster academic engagement, enhance social and emotional competencies, reduce risk behaviors, and facilitate supportive relationships within high school communities. Our ultimate goal is to prepare adolescents for adulthood both personally and professionally.

Designed for remote, in-person, or hybrid SEL instruction, the series provides essential strategies for supporting the social, emotional, and mental health needs of students - and preparing them for brighter, successful futures.

School Connect offers skills within their resource that align with our post-secondary initiatives and encompasses real world situations for students at a high school level. It also focuses on a skill deficit.

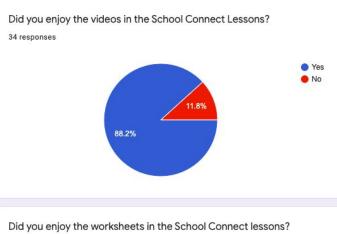

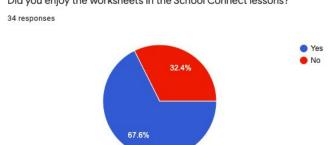


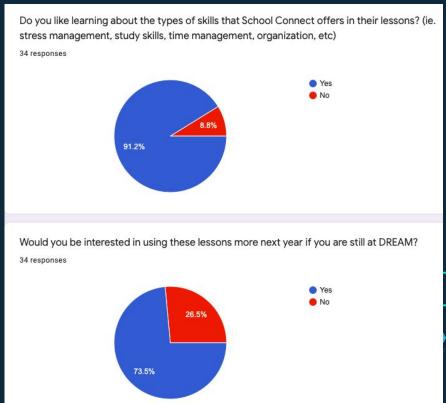
Evaluation

Cost Analysis
