We have had a great start to the semester! Our students' behavior has been wonderful, we are achieving at high levels academically (see our Illinois State Scholars), and we are continuing to provide a safe and secure environment for our students to learn and grow. Our Freshman on track percentage is at 96%, which leads all U-46 high schools. We are competing at high levels in athletics and activities (see our Athletics page). January and February can be rough months. We are already seeing a drop in our attendance. This year we have consistently seen our attendance rates at approximately 4% higher than last year. In January we have seen our attendance regress to approximately 85%. There are many factors that can contribute to these drops, many of which are outside of our control. But, if your student is healthy, please make sure they are here every day. If they are struggling, please contact their counselor or teacher. We are here to help.


As we continue into this semester, I also want to remind everyone of our STORM traits. Safe, Thoughtful, Organized, Respectful, Mindset for growth. Our students will continue to get mini lessons throughout the month of February on what those traits mean to us at SEHS. Feel free to have conversations with your students around those ideals to help support our school community in providing an environment that is designed to improve our students' sense of belonging.

We have an early release day on Wednesday 2/12/25. Traffic has been, and will continue to be a concern. For context, we are dismissing approximately 600 more students via pickup than we do on a typical day. This causes traffic to back up more than usual. We will continue to work with our district safety team and SEPD to try and find the best way to dismiss students safely and efficiently. Please be patient and kind to both the people directing traffic and each other. Busing is still a viable option for students that typically ride the bus. Busses depart at 3:05 pm.

Attention Class of 2025: Your commencement ceremony will be held at the Now Arena in Hoffman Estates at 8:00 pm on Saturday, May 24. Please plan accordingly. While this semester has so many opportunities and fun activities for our outgoing seniors along with the rest of our student body, please remember that those opportunities are privileges. In order to participate fully, we expect our students to make good decisions.



MANDATORY GRADUATION REQUIREMENT FOR HIGH SCHOOL

In order to receive a diploma from an Illinois public high school, a student must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or if applicable, the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid. This is a result of the enactment of a new law, Public Act 101-0180. The purpose of the new law is to increase awareness about the resources available to help students with post-secondary education or training. Click here for FAFSA information.

School District U-46 will be destroying all temporary, regular and special education records of students that withdrew or graduated from School District U-46 during the 19/20 school year including June, 2020. If you are interested in obtaining these records, please fill out this form and submit it to School District U-46, District Records Office, 1019 E. Chicago Street, Elgin IL 60120 before July 2, 2025.

From the Office of Climate and Culture

As we prepare for extracurricular activities such as Prom and Senior Boat Trip, we want to ensure that our expectations of achieving high academic marks and regular school attendance are viewed as a priority. As such, students will be expected to adhere to the following expectations in order to participate in these privileged activities:

- All students **must be passing five academic courses** at the time of sales and through the prom and boat trip dates.
- Students not passing five academic courses may be placed on a contract with the expectation that no failing grades are present on the day of the activity. If a course failure exists on the day, the student will not be allowed to attend and will receive a refund.
- All students must maintain a 90% attendance rate for 2nd semester.
- Cannot have 8 full days of unexcused absences or 64 single period absences.
 - Attendance office cannot go back to multiple months to excuse absences.
 - Attendance office can only go back to the last 72 hours to excuse absences.
- During the 4th quarter, a student may not receive an out-of-school suspension consequence.
- A student may not be on the loss of privilege list.



Attention Parents, Guardians and Current 11th Grade Students in the Class of 2026:

All incoming seniors for the 2025-26 school year are required to provide proof of having received their second dose of the Meningococcal vaccine *prior to the first day of school in* **August 2025** to be allowed to attend.

The first dose is normally received on or after the student's 11th birthday. The second dose is received at age 16 or older. If you receive annual physicals, there is a fair chance you may have already received this vaccine.

If you do not have a copy of your most recent vaccine records, or if you are not sure if you already received the 2nd dose of the Meningococcal vaccine, please contact your primary care doctor. Please submit proof of having had this vaccine by the first day of school in August. If you have the records, or have gotten the vaccine this year, please send in the proof of vaccine as soon as possible to the SEHS school nurses' office.

Counselor's Corner

All Students: We are a few weeks into the second semester. We cannot stress enough the importance of making sure you are taking full advantage of your class time, coming to school, being prepared and completing your work on time. Need help in a class? Peer tutoring is available the first half of all lunch periods in the collaboration space in the library Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. You can get a pass from your teacher. If you are absent from school make sure you are checking your teachers' Canvas pages to stay up to date on your work.

Seniors: Planning to attend Elgin Community College in fall of 2025? Do not wait any longer to apply! The ECC application is free, quick and easy! For information on applying as a new college student please visit **elgin.edu**. After filling out an application you will be prompted with next steps to ensure that you are registered and have early access to orientation dates once you have completed your placement tests. Don't wait!

Applications done? Time to apply for <u>scholarships</u>! Every little bit helps and the scholarships received by the high school are updated on the school website. Applications can often be involved and require essays and letters of recommendation. Do not procrastinate...apply today!

FAFSA is a graduation requirement. Colleges will also use this document to determine what financial aid they can provide. The earlier you file the better position you will be in to get the aid you are eligible for. More info on FAFSA and the Financial aid process can be found using the following link: 2025-2026 FAFSA. The FAFSA is a graduation requirement. All seniors have to complete either the 2025-2026 FAFSA or the 2025-2026 Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid (in English or Spanish). Any student/family that does not plan on completing the FAFSA will need to "opt-out" by completing the FAFSA Nonparticipation Form.

Quick reminder, if you need a mid-year transcript sent to any of your schools, please make a request in Schoolinks and let your counselor know. If you applied using Common App, mid-year transcripts will automatically be sent if needed.

Juniors: You will be taking the ACT this year! It is just around the corner. On April 15th, all Juniors will be taking the ACT. All Illinois high school students must take the ACT as part of state graduation requirements. Though this ACT is a required state test for juniors, the resulting scores are official ACT scores that can be reported to colleges during the application process, if you choose. Students, did you register to take an AP exam? Fees will soon be available to be paid via Infinite Campus under the "Fee" tab. As a reminder, full balances are due before testing begins. The first AP exam for any student is being paid for by the district, although if you are taking multiple tests you have been billed for any exams beyond the first. If you changed your mind and no longer want to take an exam, please email Mr. Venetico at anthonyvenetico@u-46.org, but please note that any exams canceled at this point will receive a \$40 cancellation fee from College Board added to your account. If you cancel the first "free" exam being paid for by the district, families will still be responsible for that cancellation fee.
