Rationale

Current curriculum is outdated.

EL Education is designed as an English Language Arts curriculum focusing on grade-level literacy skills, character, academic rigor, and active citizenship while directly aligning with our definition of a Thriving Adolescent.

Students will have equal access to high-quality complex text for their grade level being given three texts as consumables.

Students will create and produce narrative, expository, and argumentative writing that weaves in their readings.

Rationale

Students will have the opportunity to create products advocating for something of choice through podcasts, ebooks, and other media productions.

Teachers will have equal opportunity to pilot instructional lessons, resources, and professional support to ensure a guaranteed and viable curriculum is being delivered to our students.

Middle school students who are academically advanced may find regular coursework too easy and become disengaged. Honors courses offer them a chance to be challenged and remain engaged in their studies.

Implement English Language Arts curriculum and resources as a pilot for the 2024-2025 school year

Provide book bags for each ELA teacher in grades 7 and 8

Merge the Challenge and Gifted ELA courses into Honors

Begin training and professional development for each course level: Regular, ESL, Cross Cat, and Honors August 2024
