## District U-46 student repeats as Kane County Regional Spelling Bee Champion

Yahya Mohammed, a seventh grade student at Larsen Middle School in Elgin, Ill., took the top prize for the second consecutive year in the Kane County Regional Spelling Bee held at Thompson Middle School in St. Charles on Wednesday.

With a correct spelling of "intersperse" as the winning word, Mohammed earned another title after 20 rounds of competition.

He is one of eight students ranging from elementary to middle school age that competed in front of friends and family at the Regional Spelling Bee after winning competitions at their respective schools. Second place went to Myles Godinez from Immanuel Lutheran School in East Dundee, while Diana Gomez from Dundee Middle School placed third.

"We congratulate Yahya on representing Kane County once again as the champion of our Regional Spelling Bee," said Patricia Dal Santo, Regional Superintendent for Kane County. "The amount of effort put into preparing for this competition is a feat itself.
