Intentional learning: How Sycamore Trails Elementary in Bartlett earned 'exemplary' status

For the first time since 2019, an Elgin Area School District U-46 school has earned an "exemplary" designation on the Illinois School Report Card.

Sycamore Trails Elementary School in Bartlett is among dozens of suburban schools with that status, according to the 2024 school report card.

"Exemplary" schools perform in the top 10% of all schools statewide.

"We're still very excited about it," said Principal Jaclyn Jones, who delivered the news to students, teachers and staff in late October. "I'm so proud of the Sycamore Trails community. Our teachers, students and staff worked hard to earn this designation."

Since 2018, when the state started using summative designations, Sycamore Trails has been classified as "commendable" — one step below exemplary.

The Illinois State Board of Education designates schools into five categories: exemplary, commendable, targeted, comprehensive and intensive. Schools in the bottom three categories receive additional funding and support to help improve student outcomes.

Eighteen out of 51 schools in U-46 improved their designation over the last school year, and 30 remained the same this year.

Three schools in the state's second-largest district received a lower designation, officials said.

According to report card data, Sycamore Trails earned 100% of the points available in the categories of English language arts, math and science proficiency and 92% of the points available for English language arts growth.

"Our educators and all our support staff members are working very hard for our students to see these gains and make this growth," U-46 Superintendent Suzanne Johnson said at a recent school board meeting.

As the district's second-largest elementary school, Sycamore Trails serves about 630 students and has two self-contained classrooms for students with special needs, six Ignite — or gifted — classrooms and three preschool classrooms.

School and district officials noted that part of Sycamore Trails' success involved teachers being intentional about what happens in the classrooms and partnering with parents. At the start of each school year, parents are informed about what the school's goals are and teachers regularly keep parents updated about what's happening in the classrooms and what students are working on each week, said Jones, who served as assistant principal at Sycamore Trails before being named principal this year.

designation on the Illinois School Report Card. Sixth- graders made a poster to mark this designation.

"The administration and teachers are constantly asking the parents how can we serve you," said Kyle Bunker, executive director of elementary schools for U-46's Bartlett network. "The doors are always open. It's a school that serves the community, not just leads the community." He noted the school's parent-teacher organization is an integral part of the school and often attracts large groups to events it hosts.

PTO President Jennifer Casolari said the organization usually hosts at least one event a month and typically can expect at least half the families to attend.

"That's one way we build community," said Casolari, who has two children at Sycamore Trails and a third who is in middle school.

She said the "exemplary" designation for Sycamore Trails helps reaffirm what the school is doing.

"It makes me feel like my kids are really in a good place to be set up for a successful future," she said.

Lisa Cardenas, Sycamore Trails' former principal, and Jones said teachers have focused on being deliberate in their classrooms. They examined state standards, data from previous years and student performance to tailor instruction to help address student needs at all academic levels.

Jones added that in the last three or four years, the school honed in on reading and writing skills and that's when the school started to see growth.

"It's important to note this wasn't done overnight," Jones said. "It was years of very intentional work that built off each other to get to this point."

Cardenas, who now leads Laurel Hill Elementary School, said this year's exemplary designation shows the years of work paid off.

"We're on the right track," she said. "All the work was worth it."

Rick Armstrong's top 10 boys basketball teams and 25 players to watch in Aurora-Elgin area for the 2024-25 season

Waubonsie Valley lands top spot. Can Oswego East, Metea Valley and West Aurora challenge?

Top 10 Teams

1. Waubonsie Valley (27-3)

Illinois State recruit Tyreek Coleman, a 6-foot-2 senior guard, and 6-5 senior guard/forward Moses Wilson will lead the Warriors. Wilson is a Division I talent, according to coach Andrew Schweitzer. They will be joined by fellow seniors in 6-7 forward Cade Valek and 6-1 guard Joshua Tinney, who's back from an injury. Don't miss 6-3 sophomore guard/forward Kristopher Mporokoso.

2. Oswego East (21-11)

The Wolves have won 20 or more games in each of the six full seasons under coach Ryan Velasquez and should do so again. Two starters return in rising junior guard Mason Lockett, who has offers from Xavier and Minnesota, and senior guard Andrew Pohlman. Both are 6-4.

3. Metea Valley (19-11)

Senior point guard Khalil Jones, a three-year starter at St. Laurence, transfers home and

bolsters Mustangs' core of senior forwards Jake Nosek and Dominic Smith and junior guard Tre Watkins. Metea is expected to contend with Waubonsie and DeKalb for DuPage Valley Conference title.

4. West Aurora (21-11)

Three seniors in forwards Terrence Smith and Kewon Marshall and center Gabe Gonzales should lead Blackhawks' bid for a conference title in Upstate Eight West return. Sophomore guard Travis Brown will definitely help, while senior guard Jaden Edwards returns from injury.

5. Geneva (16-15)

Three of four starters who are back averaged in double figures last season and should make Vikings a strong contender in the DuKane Conference race. Leading the way will be 6-6 senior forward Hudson Kirby, who averaged 11.5 points, while 6-2 senior guard Jack Hatton clocked in at 10.5 and 5-11 junior guard Gabe Jensen added 10.

6. Batavia (22-9)

Senior forward Jax Abalos (Cornell), who averaged 11 points and five rebounds, is expected to shoulder a bigger scoring load. Senior forwards Darian Susic and Payton Wolff and senior guards Josh Kahley and Joe Schroeder should help Bulldogs contend in DuKane Conference.

West will be bolstered by four sophomores who gained varsity experience as freshmen.

9. Bartlett (19-11)

The Hawks lost 20-point scorer Nathan Scearce to graduation. A trio of seniors — twin forwards Colin and Keegan Taylor and center Dimitre Petrasiunas — will try to share the load for last year's Upstate Eight Conference runner-up. Sophomore guard Joey Cwik, who averaged 7.5 points as a freshman, also will be in the mix.

10. Oswego (4-25)

Returning senior guard/forward Dasean Patton should reach 1,000 points early in the season and will team up with senior guard Tyrell Mays. Incoming guard Ethan Vahl will have an impact as one of the state's top freshmen. Look for junior guard Mariano Velasco to be a defensive standout for first-year coach Nicholas Oraham.

Top 10 Teams

1. Yorkville (22-5)

The Foxes return four state placers in Luke Chrisse (190), Jack Ferguson (150), Ryder Janeczko (157) and Luke Zook (175). They took second in the Class 3A dual team state meet last season and will be looking for more.

2. Marmion (10-6)

The Cadets are loaded once again, featuring returning state champions in Nicholas Garcia (113) and Zach Stewart (138). Joey Favia (215) was a state runner-up and Ashton Hobson (144) was also a state placer. Demetrios Carrera (120) transferred in from South Elgin.

3. St. Charles East (24-1)

The Saints won the Class 3A dual team state meet two seasons ago and placed third last winter. Dom Munaretto (113) is a two-time world champion. Anthony Gutierrez (165) placed fourth at state last winter. Despite graduating four-time state champion Ben Davino, Saints are loaded again.

4. West Aurora (7-7)

Returning state qualifiers Evan Matkovich (126) and brothers Dayne Serio (165) and Dominic Serio (150) return for strong group. Sectional qualifier Dehmoni Dean (106) also returns as the Blackhawks get back this season to the Upstate Eight Conference.

5. Yorkville Christian (20-10)

Three-time medalist Aiden Larsen (113) is looking to add a state championship to his resume. State qualifier Robby Nelson (157) also returns as do a number of depth pieces. Mustangs sport a full lineup this season, looking to win another regional title.

6. Sandwich (23-17)
