For 40 years, The Literacy Connection, a nonprofit organization based in Elgin, has upheld its mission of providing free, quality literacy programming to adult learners seeking to improve their skills in reading, writing, and speaking English in order to improve their personal, social, and economic lives.

To commemorate its anniversary, the organization will host a celebration and resource fair with community organizations who have supported The Literacy Connection over the years in attendance.

The event will take place from 5 to 7 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 26, at the Centre of Elgin's Heritage Ballroom, 100 Symphony Way.

There will be cupcakes, lemonade, entertainment, face painting, and more. This is a

family-friendly event, and it is free and open to the public.

The Literacy Connection has two main umbrella programs which are geared toward immigrants who lack proficiency in English as well as individuals looking to improve their reading or writing skills. The Family Literacy Program is in partnership with the Boys and Girls Club of South Elgin and the Elgin Area School District U-46. Participating families receive ESL instruction, children’s services, library services, parenting sessions, and interactive literacy activities.

Wheless is proud to report that registration for both Adult Volunteer Literacy and Family Literacy have grown exponentially over the year. “We’re encouraged by our learners’ and tutors’ commitment to literacy,” she said. “We hope this anniversary resource fair will connect more people to our organization, and we look forward to sharing how people’s lives have been positively affected by their work with The Literacy Connection.”

Throughout the entire month of September, The Literacy Connection is running an online campaign fundraiser titled “Lighting the Way to Literacy.”

- Chicago Tribune/The Courier News - Construction delay could force U-46 to alter plans for moving sixth-graders to middle school buildings

School District U-46 needs to delay or modify its plans for changing school boundaries and moving sixth-graders into middle schools after officials learned plans to build a new middle school in Elgin will take longer than expected.

School board members were briefed Monday night on the construction timetable for the new \$135 million on Rohrssen Road, which is forcing the district to reevaluate how it will move middle-schoolers to new buildings.

“With the expected construction time of 20 months, this building will not be ready for occupancy for the 2026-2027 school year,” said Ann Williams, deputy superintendent of operations.

The district has just initiated the zoning and annexation process with the city of Elgin and with the Fox River Water Reclamation District, she said.

“During the design development phase, we have determined there will be extensive site work required, including underground stormwater detention and sidewalks along the perimeter of the entire property,” Williams said. “We are also waiting for the city of Elgin’s review of a traffic impact study to determine if any road work improvements are required.”

Assuming U-46 receives the necessary permits later this fall, construction bids could be sought by early 2025 and work could begin in late spring or early summer.

Because of the delay, Chief of Staff Brian Lindholm presented three possible options for shifting sixth-graders from elementary to middle school buildings.

One option would be postpone the move until the 2027-28 school year to coincide with the new middle school’s opening, Lindholm said. An estimated 7,200 students in grades 6 through 8 would remain at their currently assigned schools.

A second option would have sixth-grade classes transition to middle school campus over two school years, he said. With this plan, about 1,200 6th graders (about 50% of the grade’s students) would move into middle school in the the 2026-27 school year and the rest would remain in their current schools.

If this plan is chosen, sixth-graders living on the district’s east side would make the change in the first year and those on the west side would do the same the following year, Lindholm said. The schools included in the first year plan would be Eastview Middle School in Bartlett, Tefft and Canton middle schools in Streamwood and the new middle school currently under construction in Bartlett, he said.

Under this option, new attendance boundaries would not go into effect until the 2027-28 school year, he said. Ellis and Abbott middle schools in Elgin would close that year and Larsen and Kimball middle schools in Elgin, Kenyon Woods in South Elgin and the new school on Rohrssen Road would become buildings for sixth-, seventh- and eighth-graders.

A third option would be to implement new boundaries and send all 6th graders to middle

schools in the 2026-27 school year, Lindholm said.

“In this scenario, we would need to find alternative sites for the first year for the approximately 1,100 students who would eventually be assigned to the new middle school in Elgin as it would not be ready for occupancy,” he said.

Staff will bring its final recommendations to the school board later this fall as part of its boundary planning work, Lindholm said. Whatever the recommendation turns out to be, it will mean keeping Ellis and Abbott open for an additional year.

After the presentation, board President Melissa Owens stressed that the board has not made any decision the discussion will continue for the next several weeks.

SEIU contract ratified by District U-46 board vote

The Board of Education in School District U-46 voted 6-0, board member Kate Thommes was absent, to approve a new agreement with the Service Employees International Union (SEIU) at its meeting on Monday, Sept. 9.

SEIU represents food services employees and the new agreement is for three years through the 2026-2027 school year.

No summary of the changes was presented at the board meeting, but the 60-page document shows changes to nearly every page.

Starting hourly rates increase for most positions in 2024-2025: cook (\$17 to \$18), elementary lead (\$16 to \$17.25), elementary assistant lead (\$15 to \$16.25), food service technician (\$15 to \$16.25), food nutrition services (FNS) floater (\$15.50 to \$16.50), café relief (\$15 to \$16.50), FNS satellite lead (\$17.50 to \$19), commissary FNS technician (\$15 to \$16.75) and material expeditor (\$17.50 to \$19).

Material stockers remains at \$17 an hour while the baker, assistant cook and cook II positions are being removed.

For both 2025-2026 and 2026-2027, pay raises will be tied to the consumer price index (CPI).

“Starting salaries will increase by ½ of the CPI factor used to increase current staff hourly rates annually,” the agreement states.

There are some paid holidays added to the language including Columbus Day, Christmas Eve and Juneteenth. The agreement adds five minutes to break time for employees working 7.0+ hours a day (35 to 40 minutes) and those working 6 to 6.75 hours (25 to 30 minutes). There are changes to probationary period language with the agreement previously stating that “probationary period lasts for 60 days” to now saying the “probationary period lasts for 60 working days for external hires and 30 working days for internal employees.”

Language regarding employees who do not wish to be coerced into the union has changed. The agreement previously stated: “If the employee revokes consent for payroll to deduct dues, the Employer will comply.”

The agreement now states: “Employees seeking information to withdraw membership will be referred to the Union. The Union will inform HR of the employees’ decision to revoke consent for payroll to deduct dues. The district shall refer candidates inquiring about Union membership to the U-46 bargaining unit website.”

School calendar for year finalized in District U-46

The school calendar for the 2025-2026 has been set in School District U-46 after the Board of Education voted 6-0, board member Samreen Khan was absent, to approve the calendar on Aug. 19.

The calendar shows the first day of school being Monday, Aug. 11 (Monday, Aug. 18 for preschool) and the last day of school as Wednesday, May 20 if no emergency days are used.

The calendar aligns with neighboring districts and will assist with several major construction projects coming up in the summer of 2026, an Aug. 5 memo stated.

“It has been the now long-standing practice of School District U-46 for students to start school in the second full week of August,” the memo stated.

“The proposed calendar continues this practice. Districts 300 (Carpentersville) and 303 (St. Charles) also are continuing the practice of starting during the second full week of August for the 2025-2026 school year. Students start on Tuesday, August 12th in District 300 and

Wednesday, August 13th in District 303. We have arranged the calendar to end school as early as reasonably possible in May to allow for the many expected building construction projects that will be in full swing by the summer of 2026 to have full access to the buildings as early as we can.”

Thanksgiving break will begin on Wednesday, Nov. 26 with students returning Monday, Dec. 1, Christmas break begins Monday, Dec. 22 with students returning Monday, Jan. 5 and spring break beginning Monday, March 30 and students returning Monday, April 6.

There are 176 total instructional days for students and 185 teacher attendance days. There are nine institute days/non-attendance days.

The first trimester ends on Dec. 19 and the second trimester on Feb. 13.

Scouting Week 5 Fox Valley football games

Elgin (0-4, 0-1) at East Aurora (0-4, 0-2)

When: 7 p.m. Friday.

Last matchup: East Aurora won, 28-0, last season.

About the Maroons: Looking for its first win, Elgin enters the game coming off a solid effort in a 30-14 loss to Riverside-Brookfield last weekend. Sophomore receiver Jayden Gray had 143 yards and a touchdown, while senior tailback Aiden Coleman added 123 yards and a touchdown.

About the Tomcats: East Aurora recorded a pair of safeties during last weekend's 28-4 loss to Larkin, including a tackle by Jayden Strope of a running back in the end zone. The Tomcats

have been held to single digits in 3 of their 4 games.

South Elgin (1-3, 1-1) at West Chicago (3-1, 1-1)

When: 7 p.m. Friday.

Last matchup: South Elgin won, 57-14, last season.

About the Storm: South Elgin's 3 losses have come to teams (Barrington, Batavia, West Aurora) with 4-0 records. Last weekend, the Storm played West Aurora on even terms early thanks to a 72-yard touchdown run by DeAngelo McCullough before the Blackhawks took control in the second quarter and second half. "South Elgin still has South Elgin type players," said Wildcats coach Adam Chavez. "They have played a tough schedule. Some schemes have changed a bit, but they still have very good players on their roster."

About the Wildcats: Tailback Robert Lee and quarterback Carter Naranjo will try to exploit the Storm defense following last weekend's wild 43-35 victory over Ridgewood. "Two years ago, we would not have been able to come back and hang in there for four quarters," said Chavez. "We are learning to be winners." West Chicago suffered a 63-8 Week 3 loss to Glenbard South. "That beatdown woke us up, and the kids vowed to never let that happen again," added the coach. Chavez knows the task at hand Friday night. "We will have to be at our best to have a chance to be in the game."

Streamwood (1-3, 1-1) at Larkin (1-3, 1-1)

When: 7 p.m. Friday.

Last matchup: Larkin won, 35-14, last season.

About the Sabres: Streamwood attempts to bounce back from last weekend's 27-6 loss to Bartlett. The Sabres' lone win came in Week 3 against East Aurora (36-13).

About the Royals: Larkin tries to extend its winning streak following last weekend's 28-4 triumph over East Aurora – the school's first in the Upstate Eight West. Elijah Walker scored a touchdown off a blocked punt, while Gabriel Galvan added a 60-yard interception return for a touchdown. Quarterback Julius Yandell, Jr., tossed a 38-yard TD pass to Rian Ray.

West Aurora (4-0, 2-0) at Bartlett (1-3, 1-1)

When: 7 p.m. Friday.

Last matchup: West Aurora won, 27-12, in 2018.

About the Blackhawks: West Aurora has reached the 50-point mark in 3 of its first 4 games – the other was a 45-20 victory over a 3-1 Glenbard East team. Junior quarterback Mason Atkins has plenty of teammates to rely upon, including Iowa-bound WR Terrence Smith, Reece Powers, Azuriah Sylvester, and tailback Bryce Riley, who rushed for 223 yards on 11 carries

with a pair of long touchdown runs during last weekend's 50-7 victory over South Elgin.

About the Hawks: Coming off a 27-6 victory over Streamwood in their Upstate Eight West debut, the Hawks face the only other unbeaten team in the conference in West Aurora. The Hawks will need a big effort from their defense, led by linebackers Daniel Jasso, Ethan Ratajczyk, and lineman Donald Hubbard, against a Blackhawks team averaging 51 points per game. "We're going to need a big-time effort from every single player on our roster and stick to our game plan," Bartlett coach Milan Vuckovich said.

Batavia (4-0, 2-0) at Wheaton North (3-1, 1-1)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Bulldogs: After a slow start against St. Charles North in which they got held out of the end zone in the first half, Batavia rattled off six touchdowns, including four unanswered ones in the fourth quarter, to pull off an impressive 45-21 victory over the North Stars. RB Nathan Whitwell has been on an absolute tear, racking up 803 yards on the ground and 13 touchdowns to start the season, including 263 and five scores in Week 4. Not only that, but the defense also excelled in the fourth quarter, only allowing two North Star first downs. Despite the Bulldogs recording their third straight 40+ point performance last week, head coach Dennis Piron said that the team is still trying to find their way in aspects like the pass game. But when it does he knows that the team can be extremely good.

About the Falcons: Wheaton North has been keeping their fans on edge for most of the season, and last week was certainly no exception. The Falcons scored 20 unanswered points in the second half, including 13 in the fourth quarter, to pick up a 27-19 victory over St. Charles East last week. In all three of their wins, the Falcons came from behind to take the lead in the fourth quarter. Leading the way has been QB Nick Johnson, who's thrown all three go-ahead touchdowns for the Falcons, including a pass to Tyler Kading to give them the lead in Week 4. The last time the Bulldogs came to Wheaton North, the Falcons pulled off a fourth-quarter comeback to win 27-24.

Glenbard North (2-2, 0-2) at Geneva (4-0, 2-0)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Vikings: Through four weeks of the season, Geneva has certainly had no trouble getting their offense going, and they kept that mantra going with a 63-14 victory over Lake Park in Week 4, their fourth straight game with 45+ points. Their 212 points so far is the fifth most across the state of Illinois, keeping pace with teams like defending Class 3A champions Byron (217 points) and Class 2A semifinalist Maroa-Forsyth (227 points). QB Anthony Chahino has been a main catalyst for the offensive uptick, completing 36 of 52 passes for 1,012 yards and 17 touchdowns. Helping add to those stats have been a talented receiving duo of Georgia commit

Talyn Taylor (14 receptions, 390 yards, nine TDs) and Finnegan Weppner (11 receptions, 302 yards, five TDs).

About the Panthers: After outscoring their first two opponents 36-7 to help start the season 2-0, Glenbard North has had the script reversed to start conference play. The Panthers have been outscored 71-7, including a 31-0 shutout loss against Wheaton Warrenville South last week. The Panthers' only score during their skid came from an 80-yard connection between Ben Princis and Zechariah Moore in Week 3.

Lake Park (2-2, 0-2) at St. Charles East (1-3, 1-1)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Saints: While St. Charles East may be the only team in the DuKane conference with an overall record under .500, the Saints have proven time and time again that they can keep with high-caliber teams. And they did it again last week, taking a lead into the fourth quarter against Wheaton North before ultimately falling to them. After relying on the passing game in the first two weeks, RB Xander Salazar has taken the lead on the offense, rushing for over 100 yards in back-to-back games and scoring five touchdowns.

About the Lancers: After putting up 72 points in their first two games of the season, Lake Park struggled to put up points against a tough opening conference slate, getting outscored 119-19 against Batavia in Week 3 and Geneva in Week 4. QB George Tzamouranis has the Lancers' only offensive score over that two-week slate, recording a 2-yard rushing score late against the Vikings.

Wheaton Warrenville South (2-2, 1-1) at St. Charles North (3-1, 1-1)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the North Stars: St. Charles North is coming off a tough first loss of the season after allowing 28 straight points in the fourth quarter in a loss against Batavia, and will most likely be eager to get back in the win column. Last year's matchup between the two teams went to overtime, when the North Stars came out with a 42-35 victory. QB Ethan Plumb threw for 367 yards and five touchdowns in the last contest, and he'll be looking to get back in the saddle after a tough second-half showing last week. He did find success with WR Keaton Reinke, who was on the receiving end of 145 of his 190 passing yards on the day, including a 67-yard dot for the North Stars' only score in the second half.

About the Tigers: After a tough loss in the homecoming game to Geneva in Week 3, WW South avenged it with a 31-0 victory on the road at Glenbard North. The Tigers have put up over 30 points in three of their first four games of the season, which is something they haven't done since 2019. The QB-WR duo of Luca Carbonaro and Amari Williams lead the way for the

Tigers. The two have connected for over 400 yards and seven touchdowns so far this season, including for multiple scores in each of the last three games and for over 100 yards in each of the last two.

Kaneland (4-0, 1-0) at Morris (3-1, 1-0)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Knights: The 21 points Ottawa scored on the Knights last week was the most they've given up all year - but 14 of those came after Kaneland reached the running clock in the 49-21 win. They'll be facing a Morris team that has scored at least 30 points in every game and has reached 50 in the past two contests. Jake Buckley is disruptive on the line, with seven tackles for a loss, two sacks and a hurried pass. Jackson Slifka has made the shift from the line to linebacker, but is still disruptive as well with five tackles for a loss, a sack and a hurry. On offense, Chase Kruckenberg has completed 45 of 58 passes for 597 yards with seven touchdowns and no interceptions. Brady Brown has 16 catches for 177 yards and a score, while Dylan Sanagustin has 11 catches, 190 yards and four touchdowns.

About Morris: It didn't take long for Morris to bounce back from its first loss of the season in Week 3 to Peoria as it ultimately overwhelmed LaSalle-Peru. It did take them a little while to get going though as LaSalle-Peru held a 14-7 lead after a quarter before Morris scored 45 unanswered points to cruise to a runaway win. Morris continues to have impressive offensive balance as QB Brady Varner tossed four touchdown passes in the L-P win while RB Caeden Curran cracked the century mark rushing.

Cary-Grove (4-0 overall, 4-0 FVC) at Prairie Ridge (4-0, 4-0)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Trojans: Cary-Grove stayed undefeated with a 35-14 win over Jacobs in Week 4, reeling off 35 straight points after the Golden Eagles scored the first touchdown of the game. It was the first time the Trojans trailed all year and the first time the defensive starters allowed a TD. ... C-G ran for 393 yards on 56 carries. FB Logan Abrams did a lot of the heavy lifting with 159 yards and two TDs. QB Peyton Seaburg ran for 113 yards and two TDs, Holden Boone chipped in 74 yards, and Michael Massat added a late score. ... C-G's last win over Prairie Ridge was in 2021 (42-7). ... C-G was ranked No. 2 in last week's Associated Press Class 6A poll. The team is second in the FVC in points allowed (38).

About the Wolves: Prairie Ridge beat Huntley 35-13 in Week 4 to keep its perfect season intact and has won 18 straight FVC games, with its last loss Sept. 16, 2022, against Jacobs. ... The defending FVC champions have won the past two meetings against C-G, including 21-20 last year. ... The Wolves were ranked No. 3 in the AP Class 5A poll last week. ... QB Luke Vanderwiel ran for 238 yards and three TDs against Huntley. As a team, Prairie Ridge ran for

291 yards on 46 carries. All 13 of Huntley's points came in the fourth quarter after going down 28-0. The Wolves have allowed an FVC-low 33 points and have two shutouts.

Crystal Lake South (1-3, 1-3) at Crystal Lake Central (1-3, 1-3)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Gators: Crystal Lake South grabbed its first win of the season in Week 4 with a 9-0 shutout over Hampshire. The Gators had a monster game on defense, creating seven turnovers, which made up for almost 200 yards in penalties. Gio Evers recorded an INT and fumble recovery, Jacob Kita had two fumble recoveries, Gavin Hastings had a fumble recovery, and AJ Demirov and Noa Franch both had an INT. Brock Miller also blocked a field goal in the shutout. ... South has been rotating quarterbacks based on the matchups and have used multiple QBs in games. ... South was outscored 102-20 in its first three losses to Dundee-Crown, Prairie Ridge and Burlington Central.

About the Tigers: Crystal Lake Central went down 28-0 at halftime and lost to Burlington Central 49-0 in Week 4. The week prior, the Tigers earned their first win by beating Dundee-Crown 17-14 in overtime. ... Crystal Lake Central's offense has struggled with only 38 points in its four games, while the defense has given up 143. The Tigers had seven points in the opener against Huntley and 14 against Cary-Grove. ... In last year's crosstown rivalry game, Crystal Lake Central blanked South 34-0.

Dundee-Crown (1-3, 1-3) at Jacobs (2-2, 2-2)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Chargers: D-C has been no stranger to close games this season and came up just short last week in a 14-13 loss to McHenry, the team's third straight loss after a season-opening victory. D-C held a lead until 6:57 remaining in the game. ... D-C's three losses this season have been by a combined six points. The Chargers lost to Burlington Central 24-22 in Week 2 on a game-winning field goal and lost to Crystal Lake Central 17-14 in overtime in Week 3.

About the Golden Eagles: Jacobs' two-game winning streak, which included wins over Hampshire and Huntley, was snapped by C-G with a 35-14 loss in Week 4. ... Jacobs was led by FB Caden DuMelle with 112 yards on 14 carries. T.O. Boddie had 102 yards on 11 carries, including a 34-yard touchdown to start the game. Jacobs scored a touchdown with 37.2 seconds remaining on a 22-yard pass from QB Connor Goehring to Luke Gormsen. Jacobs defeated D-C 55-26 last season, which was the most points the Eagles scored all year.

Huntley (2-2, 2-2) at Hampshire (1-3, 1-3)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Red Raiders: Huntley lost to Prairie Ridge 35-13 in Week 4, a game in which the Raiders trailed 28-0 after three quarters. Huntley has dropped two games in a row since starting 2-0. ... QB Braylon Bower went 19-of-29 passing for 164 yards and two TDs against Prairie Ridge. Wyatt Fleck (seven catches, 54 yards) had a 1-yard touchdown reception, and Zach Rysavy added a 6-yard score. Gavin Havens had a team-high 67 rushing yards. Huntley ended up with 280 yards to Prairie Ridge's 305.

About the Whip-Purs: Hampshire lost to Crystal Lake South in Week 4 for its third straight loss after defeating McHenry 17-16 in the season opener. ... Hampshire's Week 2 loss to Jacobs (28-21) was by only seven points, so the Whips have been competitive in three of four games outside of a 41-20 loss to Prairie Ridge in Week 3. ... Hampshire lost to Huntley 34-7 last year.

Burlington Central (3-1, 3-1) at McHenry (1-3, 1-3)

When: 7 p.m. Friday

About the Rockets: Burlington Central had no trouble in a Week 4 win over Crystal Lake Central 49-0, giving the Rockets their third win already. Central has finished 4-5 in each of the past two seasons. ... The Rockets trail only Prairie Ridge and C-G in the FVC. ... In the Week 4 win, Central allowed only 66 yards, with 30 coming on one play against backups. ... QB Jackson Alcorn was 13-of-18 passing for 220 yards and three TDs. WR/DB LJ Kerr had four catches for 78 yards and two TDS and also had an INT on defense. LB Sam Maglares had a forced fumble and recovered two fumbles. RB/LB Zach Samaan added two rushing TDs and one INT in the dominant victory. ... Central's 55 points allowed is third best in the FVC. ... The Rockets beat McHenry 17-7 last season.

About the Warriors: McHenry earned its first win of the season with a come-from-behind 14-13 win against Dundee-Crown in Week 4. It was the team's first conference win since winning the last two games of the 2022 season. McHenry had lost 12 FVC games in a row. ... The Warriors scored a touchdown with 6:57 left to cut D-C's lead to 13-12. Conner McLean then added a 2-point conversion to put McHenry up for good. ... RB Jacob Jones led the way with 60 yards rushing and Jeffry Schwab chipped in 49. Schwab also caught a touchdown from QB Dayton Warren. Nolan Chovanec had a TD and 30 rushing yards.

Marmion (3-1) at Montini (2-2)

When: 7:30 p.m. Friday
