Dear Colleagues,

It is wonderful to see our Strategic Plan almost complete as we continue to support our focus on standards-based learning and assessment, rigorous student tasks and assessments, and academic teaming.

Prior to Spring Recess, the Board of Education received two updates on the Strategic Plan. While the new Strategic Plan includes similar components as included in the current plan, the new plan also includes:

- Our U-46 Promise - We promise a safe, caring environment where every student experiences the joy of learning and is empowered and prepared for a successful future.
- Portrait of a U-46 Graduate, an outline of the attributes we want our graduates to have - Empowered Leader; Inquisitive Thinker; Collaborative Communicator; Tenacious Learner; and Global Change Agent.
- Goals and Measures of Student Progress, clearly defined goals for student success, each tied to measures of student progress.
- Signature Strategies, the building blocks and practices we're going to use as we proceed.

As a reminder, we have involved many partners in this work including students, teachers, parents, administrators, community members and local employers. These partners provided valuable direction and feedback to create this plan and support our student driven vision. Yet, we have much work to complete, once the Board of Education approves the Strategic Plan later this spring. That work will include:

- Reviewing and analyzing data trends to establish measurable goals for all areas.
- Completion of a Strategic Plan Dashboard to be accessible on the U-46 webpage.

- Drafting a communication plan to share our new Strategic Plan with our students, families, colleagues and community members.
- Establishing quarterly goals to be monitored and revised as needed.
