U-46 board OKs \$600,000 land purchase for new Elgin middle school

The **District U-46 School Board** has unanimously approved the \$600,000 purchase of 12.3 acres of vacant Elgin land at 2604 Rohrssen Road from the Archdiocese of Chicago.

A new middle school is to be built on the site at a cost of about \$100 million, U-46 officials have said. The project to be completed by July 2026.

The board also was briefed at its March 18 meeting on the progress being made in converting Hawk Elementary School in Bartlett into a middle school.

Chief of Staff Brian Lindholm told the board that the district is moving a community engagement session from April 4 to 7 p.m. Wednesday, May 8, at Eastview Middle School, 321 Oak Ave., Bartlett.

The later date means will allow staff to be able to discuss the new school's boundary recommendations, which are to be presented to the board in April, Lindholm said.

- Daily Herald - U-46 buys Elgin land for middle school

As work progresses on transforming **Hawk Hollow Elementary School** in Bartlett into a middle school, Elgin Area School District U-46 board members signed off on buying 12.3 acres in Elgin for a new middle school.

School board members approved the \$600,000 purchase this week. The land, owned by the Archdiocese of Chicago, is located at 2604 Rohrssen Road and is adjacent to Hilltop Elementary School in Elgin.

The purchase, finalized in late February, advances the district’s goal of including sixth grade in all of its middle schools. The district’s elementary schools currently include sixth grade students.

Last year, voters approved a measure that allows the district to borrow \$179 million to use toward a \$380 million building program to rebuild five elementary schools, including Lowrie, McKinley, and Century Oaks in Elgin, Parkwood in Hanover Park and Glenbrook in Streamwood. Built in the 1800s, Lowrie and McKinley are the oldest of the five schools.

The building plan also includes updates to various elementary schools. The district, however, did not seek approval for a more costly building plan that would have included

middle schools. District officials estimate middle school conversions will cost \$200 million.

Some Elgin residents have questioned the district's plan for the Rohrsen Road property and to build a new middle school when the 2023 referendum focused on elementary schools.

"Building middle schools and spending over \$200 million more than planned was purposefully, and by design, not shared with the public prior to the referendum vote," Elgin Resident Paul Halverson told board members this week.

In December, U-46 Chief of Staff Brian Lindholm noted many of the district's elementary schools have seen declining enrollment numbers. As the district transitions sixth grade students to middle schools, those elementary enrollments will drop even further and could prompt the consolidation or closure of some elementary schools, Lindholm said.

In response to Halverson's comments, Lindholm Friday noted the district has long discussed investing in the middle schools, both before and after the referendum.

Also at Monday's board meeting, district officials discussed progress on boundary discussions. The district held a series of meetings and conducted community surveys to help identify key factors when determining new school boundaries.

Though 200 people participated in community surveys or in-person meetings, the district plans to reopen a community survey in early April.

"We do realize this is a small percentage of the U-46 community," Lindholm said, "and we'd like to gather feedback from a wider group and also ensure that we're hearing equally from residents across U-46."

Club serves 3,000 U-46 students each year

Elgin Area **School District U-46** celebrated its 20-year partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of Elgin recognizing it with the Elgin Area Chamber of Commerce's Business Partner of the Year Award.

U-46 Chief of Staff Brian Lindholm presented the award to Boys & Girls Club Chief Executive Officer Cathy Russell and Chief Operating Officer Natalie Pawluk during the chamber's annual meeting on March 20.

Lindholm said the Boys & Girls Club serves about 3,000 U-46 students each year from 34 schools at 28 sites, nearly 10% of the district's student population.

"Thousands of U-46's students' lives have been changed through access to Boys & Girls Club programs that support their growth to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens," Lindholm said.

The formal relationship between U-46 and the Boys & Girls Club dates back to 2004 when the organization started serving students at Larsen Middle School. In subsequent years, the organization expanded its reach to elementary and high school students, and began serving U-46 students in elementary school buildings to reach more families.

While the club was founded in Elgin, in the past six years, it has broadened its geographic reach to Streamwood, Hanover Park and South Elgin, all communities served by U-46.

Lindholm noted the partnership deepened during the COVID-19 pandemic when U-46 worked with the Boys & Girls Club to design ways to support remote learning and offer after-school programming when schools were closed to in-person instruction. The wake

of the pandemic also was when the Boys & Girls Club began offering special summertime programming to U-46 students; those programs are expected to reach about 1,500 students this summer.

Russell said the organization's goal is to "serve all of the kids who need us most, and to be there for them when school is out."

She praised U-46 leadership for being creative and thinking outside the box.

"Partnership goes both ways, and you can only do what people allow you to do," Russell said. "U-46 has been an amazing partner to work with. We really appreciate it."

- The Examiner - Roof replacement project among ratified U-46 items

The Board of Education in **School District U-46** voted 6-0, board member Veronica Noland was absent, on \$2 million of expenditure items at its meeting on Monday, March 11.

Included was a \$1.8 million (operations and maintenance fund) bid from Preservation Services for a roof replacement project at Bartlett's Centennial Elementary School.

The school was originally built in 1990 with a roof replacement done in 2007. That replacement "roof has outlived its useful life, can no longer be repaired, and is recommended for replacement," the proposal stated.

Costing \$109,500 (education fund) with Northwestern University's Center for Talent Development, the board approved a summer enrichment program which is "a resource to support out-of-school learning experiences that bridge IGNITE instruction for 4th-6th grade," the proposal states.

With Branching Minds, the district will spend \$50,715 (education fund). "The intent of this partnership with Branching Minds is to assist staff members in significantly reducing, if not all together eradicating, the overidentification of African American students to special education with a diagnosis of emotional disability," the proposal stated.

The board also unanimously approved a list of authorized depositors as well as a resolution approving a declaration of trust.

The list of authorized depositors remains the same with one addition. PMA Securities, the Illinois School District Liquid Asset Fund, JP Morgan Chase and Fifth Third Bancorp all remain the same while PFM Asset Management (Illinois Trust) has been added to the list.

The addition of PFM is to “segregate interest earnings tied to the referendum bond issues and ensure federal compliance relating to arbitrage,” a memo from Ann Williams, deputy superintendent of operations, stated.

The declaration of trust resolution allows PFM to “act on behalf” of the district “to invest available funds so as to enhance their investment opportunities.” Also unanimously approved was itemized bills totaling \$26.7 million.

Bartlett High principal removed by Dist. U-46

School District U-46 has removed Mike Demovsky as principal at Bartlett High School, and Melanie Meidel was placed as the interim principal for the rest of the school year.

Demovsky was placed on administrative leave on Friday, March 15, but details are sparse with regards to why the decision was made.

U-46 “became aware of concerns regarding certain administrative practices... which triggered an ongoing investigation,” according to a district statement. The concerns “do not involve the safety of any past or current students or staff.”

Meidel was a former South Elgin High School principal and district assistant superintendent before her retirement.

“We are fully committed to ensuring that Bartlett High School operations and educational programs continue seamlessly during this period,” said Superintendent Suzane Johnson. “Ms. Meidel brings a wealth of experience and a deep understanding of our school community, which will be invaluable during this transition. We are confident in Ms. Meidel’s leadership and the strength of our Bartlett High School staff to continue providing the best learning environment for our students.”

The Board of Education, by a 7-0 vote, approved a resolution authorizing reclassification of a principal and reassignment to classroom teacher at its meeting on Monday, March 18. Although not named, it is believed to be related to Demovsky.

The meeting also included two public commentators, a parent and a student, who spoke in support of Demovsky.

Emily Guadarrama, a Bartlett High School junior and member of the principal student advisory board, called Demovsky “one of the best principals the school has ever had,” and “I have never met someone so enthusiastic to be at school at 7 a.m. every day.”

Guadarrama said that Demovsky was “rumored to be altering the grades of some of his students.” She said Demovsky was treated as “a criminal and escorted out” of school while other staff have been investigated for “inappropriate relationships with their students” who were escorted out in the same manner.

U-46 would not confirm Demovsky was “altering grades” when asked by The Examiner. Karla Jiménez, director of school and community relations, stating the “investigation is ongoing,” and “due to this being a personnel matter, we cannot share further details.

Brock Friedman, a Bartlett parent, also praised Demovsky and also requested the district at least allow him to hand out diplomas at graduation because that is “what our kids want.”

Aurora Central Catholic: The Chargers will aim to finish in the upper half of the GCAC

and reach the Class 2A state meet for the 26th time in the last 28 years. Sophomore Ceci Hilby took sixth in the state in the 800 last year before taking third in the 800 at the recent Illinois Top Times indoor state championships. Freshman Annalyse McCarty has star potential in the sprints, relays, and jumps. Olivia Koral (sprints/relays) is the Chargers' only senior. Key juniors are Mayte Acosta (sprints/relays), Carolina Dervis (long sprints/relays), Nicole Smith (distance), Cayla Oldenburger (pole vault), Sofia Corral (long sprints/relays), Cece Vasquez (throws), and Addison Sajdak (hurdles/jumps).

Bartlett: The Hawks have returning UEC champion senior Kim Olwoch (discus) as well senior Kristin Farabaugh (second in 800) back. Junior Elsie Nwabuego (discus) took third in conference while sophomore Alyssa Gregory took third in the 800. Bartlett will get great leadership from seniors Amadea Montijo in the 400, and Aashna Patel in the long jump. Junior Esther Sangobowale (shot put) took fifth at sectionals while sophomore Wynnie Piskule has already made the state qualifying height in the high jump.

Batavia: The Bulldogs won the DuKane Conference championship before taking fourth place at sectionals. Senior Izzy Taylor (3-time all-state in 4x100/4x200/4x400 in 2022, state qualifier in 4x100/4x400 in 2023) will be a huge factor. Taylor's returning 4x100/4x400 downstate teammates are Mariah Wilson, Madison Wilson, and Elizabeth Wende. Seniors Sarah Hecht (throws), and Alli Olson (distance) should be major contributors.

Burlington Central: The Rockets won a sectional title before tying for 11th place in Class 2A. Their returning state qualifiers are Abby Burke (3,200 and XC), Maddie Mucci (triple jump/4x200), Kenzie Andersen (4x200/4x400), Danica Wiegel (4x200), Keira Heindl (4x200), Corryn Kester (4x400), and Sia Patel (4x200). "We graduated some huge point scorers last year, but I think we are going to be deeper in our overall team depth," said coach Vince Neil. "Look for this team to continue to build week after week, and we can put all the pieces together by the championship phase of our season."

Cary-Grove: The Trojans will be without the services of two graduated state qualifiers in Lindsey Kownick (100 hurdles) and Annika Nordin (shot put). Cary-Grove (fifth in FVC) has 300 hurdles state qualifier Kate Aniolkowski (sprints/hurdles) back to help lead the troops. The Trojans also have sophomores Olivia Parker, Kennedy Manning (jumps), and Caelie Mendro (pole vault) doing sprints and hurdles at the varsity level. Coach Mark Anderson said that the indoor season has gone well, there are a lot of talented/hard-working kids on the team, and they should be able to finish in the top half of the FVC.

Crystal Lake South: The Gators have senior Abby Machesky (400/800/1,600) back from injury last year after she qualified for the state meet in the 800 as a sophomore. Senior Ava Freund was all-conference in the shot put last year while junior teammate Emily

Kupiec (triple jump) is another key in the field events. Liv and Tori Pinta will be middle distance runners along with Brie James, Colette Bacidore, Lily Brooks, Sedona Semradek, and CeCe Piemontese. The addition of freshman Gracey LePage should help improve the Gators' sprint group.

Dundee-Crown: The Chargers return a pretty inexperienced squad from a team that placed eighth in the FVC. Senior leaders will be Sarah Bernstein (hurdles/jumps), Grace Bourbon (hurdles/jumps), Val Ortega (sprints), Ashley Arista (sprints), and Yvonne Castro (distance). Key juniors will be Marisa Klaas (jumps/hurdles), Oliwia Drozd (sprints/long jump), and Gisel Castaneda (distance). Sophomores D'Angel Slater (sprints) and Alexandra Burczynski (distance) will be joined by freshmen Delilah Kissane (sprints), Penny Murray (hurdles/jumps), and Ashley Leon (distance).

Elgin: The young Maroons squad is still going to be facing an uphill struggle in the UEC this spring as they placed 10th in the indoor conference meet two weeks ago at Glenbard East. Sophomore Emma Valdivia will be a runner to watch in the 800 along with freshman teammate Teagan Culver in the 1,600 and 3,200.

Geneva: The Vikings bring back a lot more depth from a team that placed sixth in the DuKane Conference. Seniors Reilly Day (sprints/jumps), Sarah Hahn (middle distance), Vicki Karalis (throws), Kendall Young (pole vault/high jump), Brooke Lussnig (sprints/long jump), and Avery Whitehead (sprints) are back. Junior Bridget Hecker (sprints) and sophomore Sofia Borter (distance) give Geneva even more depth.

Hampshire: The Whip-Purs placed sixth in the FVC and ninth at sectionals. The 4x800 state qualifying team of Alyssa Garcia, Hannah Jones, Hudson Szymonik, and Ella Perrone are all back as is senior Hailey Caraway, who placed ninth in the Class 3A state high jump competition. Perron also qualified for state in the 800 while Szymonik qualified in the 1,600. Senior Claudia Kuk (long jump/triple jump) is an athlete to watch while Cassidy Papa (sprints/pole vault), and Hailey Homola (shot put/discus) are key newcomers.

Jacobs: The Golden Eagles placed eighth at sectionals as senior Sohini Lawrence (pole vault) qualified for state. Senior Camryn Cook placed third at sectionals in shot put. Junior Bailey Schwartz was the 3,200-meter champion at the recent FVC indoor meet while teammates Jackie Then (relays), Kathleen Kania (1,600), and Carly Uehlein (discus) will be competing in sprints and relays. "This year we are looking to continue to send more of our girls to the state meet," said coach Jason Wright.

Kaneland: The Knights are moving up to Class 3A this year after placing second at sectionals in Class 2A. Augustana University-bound senior Cora Heller will be counted on heavily in sprints, long jump, discus, and her best event pole vault (state qualifier). Olivia Pastovich (state qualifier in 300 hurdles) is strong in hurdles, sprints, and relays

while Danielle Bower is the teams' top distance runner. Other distance runners are Graycen Cole, Abby Fitts, and Abbie Mederich. Payton Burnett, Linda Ray, Amani Meeks, and Pastovich will come together for some really strong relays. Lilia Fleshman (mid-distance), Olivia D'Escoto (shot put), and Charlotte Krageare (shot put) are other keys.

Larkin: The Royals will try to improve on their seventh-place finish in the UEC behind Theresa Davis (sixth in UEC in 100 hurdles), and Maya Nail (long jump/triple jump). "We have several new runners who show lots of promise," said coach Heather Carey. "Our main focus is on developing that talent as well as helping our seniors reach their full potential this season."

Rosary: The Royals placed fourth at the Ridgewood Class 2A sectional with 55 points. Rosary junior Chiara Surtz qualified for state in the 3,200, but state qualifiers Libby Saloga (4x400/pole vault) and Grace Loy (high jump) graduated. The Royals' pack of Olivia Kunio, Peyton Saltijeral, and Lily Caruso also ran on that 4x400 state team with Saloga in 2023.

South Elgin: The Storm tied for third place with West Chicago at the 10-team UEC indoor meet two weeks ago. Senior Amaya Teague took second in the 55 and 200-meter dashes at the indoor meet while freshman Karla Diaz placed fourth in the 400. Teague, Kaylin Olson (second in triple jump), Ceilidh Bicocchi, and Alexandra Stephen placed second in the 4x200 while senior Ariann Gutierrez took second in the shot put. **St. Charles East:** The Saints have senior Marley Andelman (800/1,600) back from their all-state, sixth-place 4x800 relay team. St. Charles East will be relying on a lot of key sophomores, including Addie Schilb (triple jump/sprints), Maddie Piekarz (sprints), Naomi Moody (sprints), and Addison Wagner (pole vault/high jump). "We're a very young team with the majority of our varsity being sophomores," said coach Brad Kaplan. "We're looking to compete at our best when it matters come conference and sectional time."

St. Charles North: The North Stars placed seventh in the DuKane Conference and seventh at sectionals. Junior Tosin Oshin is off to a great start to the new campaign as she won the indoor conference shot put crown. The young squad's 4x800 relay team will be led by freshmen Gwen Hobson and Julia Rodney. Alanna Gupta (300 hurdles), Reese Thomas (800/300 hurdles), Ava Miedema (400), Zoe Ulaszek (400), and Aliya Clayton (pole vault/long jump) will be major factors.

Streamwood: The Sabres placed eighth in the 10-team UEC indoor championships in mid-May, and junior Sophia Baumert was impressive in winning both the 800 and 1,600-meter runs. Streamwood's junior duo of Elissa Callender and Areona Murry placed 4-5 in the shot put competition while Callender also placed seventh in the high jump.



Glenbard North batters provided more than enough firepower in Jeremy Cooney's 2024 pitching debut Thursday against **Larkin**.

push across the runs. Ben Haney got the last two outs.





- Daily Herald - Marengo grits out win over Streamwood on a blustery day

There will assuredly be more aesthetically pleasing victories for Marengo's baseball team than Monday's 17-9 nonconference triumph over **Streamwood**.

The conditions — low-50-degree temperatures with 13 mph winds and a steady drizzle — were less than desirable. But the Indians battled through, scored almost at will despite a total of six hits, and basically beat the Sabres by making far fewer mistakes.

“The elements were tough, but we've been taught that we don't complain and we're stuck in it,” Marengo shortstop Quinn Lechner said. “It's the same for both sides and the tougher team's going to come out on top.”

Marengo (4-4) batted around three times in the game, constantly put pressure on **Streamwood** (1-2) with stolen bases and extra bases. The Indians took full advantage of 17 free passes (14 walks and Lechner with three hit by pitches) and the Sabres' eight errors.

Streamwood more than doubled the Indians' hits with 13, but Marengo led all the way in a game that took 3 hours, 12 minutes.

The game likely would not have been started had it not been played at Lee Pfund Stadium, an all artificial-turf field.

Marengo coach Nick Naranjo called the win “gritty” to his team afterward.

“Just being able to continue to keep battling, especially when things aren’t going our way,” Naranjo said. “We talked about it’s a tough day to pitch, a tough day to play defense or stand out there with balls that are slick. There were a lot of walks. But I loved the way our guys battled.

“Offensively, we took what they were giving us, they were giving us free bases. Being able to capitalize on that and put the ball in play when we needed to and putting pressure on the defense was key. We did that really well today.”

Streamwood coach Dan Jennings lamented the free passes and miscues the Sabres committed.

“If you get two outs, the next guy has to be Strike 1,” Jennings said. “It was usually Ball 1, Ball 2, Ball 3 and we gave up cheap runs at the end. It was really hard to get out of every inning, even though our guys swung it very well.

“We gave up a lot of freebies. A lot of basic stuff, pick over to first base, we probably had four errors on those. It’s tough to win when you give three, four, five, six, seven outs.”

Streamwood actually got back in the game with a five-run sixth inning, cutting the Indians’ lead to 11-8. But Marengo came back with six runs on one hit in the seventh, Lechner’s RBI single.

“We knew the (strike) zone well and had a patient approach and took a lot of walks and extra bases on overthrows,” Lechner said.

Marengo junior Robert Heuser allowed two earned runs over five innings and struck out seven, walking only two. He also delivered a two-run single in the Indians’ five-run fifth.

“Just threw strikes and prayed to God,” Heuser said. “Honestly, just hitting spots, and my offspeed was working.”

Naranjo was especially pleased with Heuser’s effort given the conditions. Through four innings he had five strikeouts, one walk and no earned runs. He left runners on second and third in the fifth with his final strikeout.

“He looked really good in the first four,” Naranjo said. “We talked about keeping hitters

off-balance. If we had to, pitch backwards when we needed to.

“(Heuser) had Schaumburg, Wauconda and **Streamwood**, he’s pitched against some bigger schools, but he’s done extremely well throwing strikes and putting us in a position to win baseball games. Being able to do that today was really nice.”

The Sabres’ top four hitters gave Marengo problems. Leadoff man Antonio Alanis was 4 for 5 with a homer, Miguel Rodriguez was 2 for 4 with a double and an RBI, Dylan Love was 2 for 4 with a double and an RBI and Austin Paskewic was 2 for 5 with an RBI.




