

'An entire life of pensions and six-figure incomes': Officials tout \$8 million grant for apprenticeship

programs

Roughly \$8 million in federal funding will help Illinois high schools train students for positions operating heavy machinery and secure high-paying careers in fields facing critical workforce shortages.

U.S. Rep. Raja Krishnamoorthi visited South Elgin High School on Thursday to announce the grant provided through the Apprenticeships Build America program. Representatives of industry groups and a national apprenticeship program joined local school officials for the announcement in an automotive shop classroom.

The Youth Workforce Development Foundation and the Associated Equipment Distributors will partner with SkillsUSA Illinois, Inc. to provide heavy equipment and diesel technology training programs that can be cost-prohibitive for schools.

Eric Hill, CEO of the Youth Workforce Development Foundation, said the grant money will help employers build youth-focused apprenticeship programs.

"With this grant, I'm truly excited to see a sustainable model where our students are going to have a pipeline to long-term career opportunities in the heavy equipment space," Hill said.

The funding will help enhance SkillsUSA chapter programs and connect program graduates to career opportunities. In addition, it will support career-focused events, where students receive hands-on instruction with industry companies and laborers.

Elgin Area School District U-46 is part of an Illinois Education for Employment region with Algonquin-based Community School District 300, Central Unit District 301 and St. Charles Unit District 303. The region's apprenticeship program partnered with AED three years ago.

The program went from 52 paid internships two summers ago to 150 last summer.

Brian McGuire, president and CEO at AED, said apprenticeships are vital for American industry and the economy.

"For a long time, they've kind of been on the back burner," McGuire said. "It's good to see programs like this that put them front and center and recognize that these skilled careers are important to keeping our country moving."

Mark Poulos of Operating Engineers Local 150 said the benefit to students can last a lifetime.

"These jobs that we provide, they're not just jobs, but they're careers," Poulos said. "This provides an entire life of pensions and six-figure incomes."

Krishnamoorthi said that due to an aging workforce, there are 40,000 job vacancies projected in the heavy equipment supply chain.

"That's where South Elgin High School comes into play because you are helping to train the next generation of workers," he said.

Charlie Watt, a junior at South Elgin High School, is in his second year in the automotive program and plans to pursue an internship through the program this summer.

He said the auto program is giving him a head start on a career as an airplane mechanic.

"I love this class," Watt said. "This is one of the main reasons I come to school. I can't sit in a class and just write. Here we're doing stuff every day, and it's a new thing every day."

The Youth Workforce Development Foundation has received nearly \$8 million in funding through the federal Apprenticeships Build America program to help Elgin-area students and others in Illinois get training to be heavy machinery operators.

U.S. Rep. Raja Krishnamoorthi, D-Schaumburg, joined officials from the foundation, Associated Equipment Distributors and School District U-46 in announcing the grant at an event Thursday at South Elgin High School.

The money "will help us continue to develop and strengthen our (Career and Technical Education) programs," U-46 School Board President Melissa Owens said. "I look forward to seeing the positive impact these partnerships and programs will have on our students' futures."

The funding is a shot in the arm to programs that offering skills to students who want to go into trade professions rather than going to college, said Eric Hill, CEO of the Youth Workforce Development Foundation, speaking in a news release on the grant.

"We know from our successful career pathways events and competitions and our work in schools across Illinois throughout the year that students are ready for success in careers that don't require a four-year college degree," Hill said. "But they first need to know what it will take to prepare for them.

"This exciting partnership with (Associated Equipment Distributors) will help turn on more young people to well-paying careers in an industry that needs new talent," he said.

Earlier this summer, the Biden administration announced the grant as part of more than \$244 million being distributed through the U.S. Department of Labor to help expand the Registered Apprenticeship system, the release said.

The heavy equipment supply chain is critical to the national economy, but workforce shortages in diesel technicians and heavy equipment operators are expected to exceed from 24,000 to 42,000 within a decade with retirements and career changes.

The foundation and AED will work in Illinois to help schools provide the necessary heavy equipment training programs, the release said. They also will work to recruit women and minorities into the field, officials said.

One of the key partners in the grant is SkillsUSA Illinois Inc., a state association focused on ensuring the future of skilled trade professionals, which will focus on enhancing SkillsUSA chapter programs and connecting program graduates to career opportunities, the release said.

"Whether that's working as technicians, whether that's in the operators or getting into construction manufacturing, all of these jobs are interconnected," said Eric Hill, CEO of the Youth Workforce Development Foundation. "The skillsets that our students are learning right here in our high school programs across the country are so invaluable."

Hill said the Biden administration is providing more than \$245 million in grants to offer training programs and career focused pathways events. This comes as workforce shortages for diesel technicians and heavy equipment operators are expected to nearly double in the next decade due to retirements and career changes.

"There is so much demand and need, especially post pandemic, connecting the students with those career opportunities at all levels," said Sen. Cristina Castro (D-Elgin). "There are some that will go to higher education and there are those that wants to go into vocational and technical. There are jobs now."

Rep. Raja Krishnamoorthi (D-IL) and Rep. Nikki Budzinski (D-IL) ensured the state received a significant chunk of the new funding. They believe the grant program can provide students with additional training to help pursue successful careers and strengthen America's middle class.

"These private employers that AED represents are going to snap up these people right away," Krishnamoorthi said. "They're going to snap them up and put them into jobs, and then they're going to pay taxes. Those taxes are going to support our community and it becomes a virtuous cycle."

Lincoln Land Community College and South Elgin High School each received close to \$8 million in funding through the Apprenticeships Build America Program.

"About 38% of our new apprentices have four-year college education for a lot of the new apprentices," said Marc Poulos of Operating Engineers Local 150. "But that isn't to say that there isn't room for a whole lot of folks that don't choose that four-year college track."

Wheaton Academy 28, St. Charles East 17: Quarterback Nathan Downey completed 14 of 22 passes for 232 yards and 4 touchdowns to lift Wheaton Academy (1-1) to a 28-17 nonconference win over St. Charles East (0-2) in West Chicago.

The Saints grabbed a 7-0 lead on a 14-yard touchdown pass from JT Padron to Peter VanLue before the Warriors answered with an 83-yard TD toss from Downey to Zach Moravec.

Trailing 10-7, the Warriors relied on another big play -a 43-yard touchdown pass from Downey to Moravec to take a 14-10 halftime lead.

After St. Charles East scored on its first second-half possession, a 21-yard touchdown pass from Padron to junior receiver Sheko Gjokaj, the Warriors took the lead for good on Downey's 8-yard TD pass to Moravec.

Early in the fourth quarter, Wheaton Academy added some insurance on Downey's 29-yard TD pass to senior receiver Jake Weston. Moravec paced the Warriors with 133 yards receiving and 3 touchdowns, while tailback Brandon Kiebles ran for 79 yards.

On the defensive side, the Warriors limited the Saints to 42 yards rushing, paced by senior Jeremiah Johanik (11 tackles). Diyonnes King added a pair of sacks and 3 tackles for loss.

Montini 21, Hillcrest 0: The Broncos (2-0) used a swarming defense to pitch their second consecutive shutout of the season, blanking Hillcrest, 21-0.

Senior defensive back Vince Irion led the way with a team-high 13 tackles, including 2 for loss and a sack. Irion added a 56-yard interception return for a touchdown to ice the game in the fourth quarter.

Nick Irion (11 tackles), Sean Hubeny (6 tackles), Isaac Alexander (5 tackles, forced fumble) and Max Bell (3 tackles, interception) sparked the Broncos' secondary, while defensive tackle JC Hayes recorded 9 tackles, including 3 for loss. Linebacker Jaxon Lane added 10 tackles and a forced fumble, while Jeremiah Peterson had 8 tackles. JoJo James (9 carries, 112 yards, 1 TD) paced the rushing attack, while quarterback Izzy Abrams completed 4 of 8 passes and 70 yards, including a 23-yard touchdown toss to Isiah Mason (4 catches, 81 yards).

Gaetano Carbonara completed 3 passes for 26 yards.

Glenbard South 41, East Aurora 7: Senior tailback Vontae Clark scored 4 touchdowns covering 11, 9, 19 and 22 yards, during the Raiders' 41-7 victory over East Aurora.

Jonny Baldauf opened the scoring with a 45-yard punt return for a touchdown, as the Raiders built a 20-0 first-quarter lead.

Freshman tailback Elijah Donahue scored a pair of touchdowns — on a 44-yard kick return and a 39-yard run, while quarterback Tommy Bauman tossed a 59-yard touchdown pass to Anthony Baldauf late in the first half.

York 35, Plainfield North 13: The Dukes improved to 2-0 with their 35-13 nonconference victory over host Plainfield North (0-1).

Quarterback Bruno Massel connected with Finton Helm on a 3-yard touchdown pass to give York a 7-0 lead before Massel's long pass to PJ McLafferty set up his 10-yard touchdown pass to 6-foot-7 tight end Hunter Stepanich made it 14-0.

After the Tigers closed within 14-7, the Dukes tallied 21 unanswered points, highlighted by Henry Duda's 80-yard touchdown run. Duda's 11-yard TD run capped the scoring.

Fenton 43, Streamwood 8:

Quarterback Nathan Stewart passed for 239 yards during Fenton's 43-8 Upstate Eight crossover victory over Streamwood (0-2) at Millennium Field. Stewart's 23-yard touchdown toss to Jack Tinajero helped seal the decision for the Bison, who added 155 rushing yards.

Metea Valley 31, Plainfield Central 6:

Metea Valley (1-1) snapped a 14-game losing streak with its 31-6 nonconference triumph over Plainfield Central in Aurora.

Quarterback Jake MacLeod threw 4 touchdown passes to 3 different receivers — Swaroop Bhaskar, Dominic Smith, and a pair to Dylan Liner for the Mustangs' first win since 2022.

Jace Mohead's interception set up Cameron Leys' 36-yard field goal, while Liner added another

interception.

West Chicago 57, Joliet Central 28:

Senior tailback Robert Lee rushed for 293 yards and 3 touchdowns on 21 carries, while junior quarterback Carter Naranjo added 173 yards on 11 carries and 4 rushing touchdowns during the Wildcats' 57-28 nonconference victory over Joliet Central.

West Chicago (2-0) established a single-game school record with 622 rushing yards.

The Wildcats open Upstate Eight East play Friday at Glenbard South (1-1).

Friday's game against South Elgin was supposed to be a learning game for Batavia quarterback Bodi Anderson.

After a self-described tough showing in the opening game against Glenbard West, the junior

quarterback was taking the Week 2 matchup to work on reading the defense.

But after finding Isaiah Brown for a 57-yard touchdown in the first quarter, Anderson said he definitely learned something.

"It made me a lot more comfortable with him and made me realize I can throw it up to him and I can trust he'll get it," Anderson said. "The confidence just really kicked in for me."

The confidence helped Anderson end the first half completing 9 of 14 passes for 155 yards and three touchdowns to pace the Bulldogs to a 42-14 victory over the Storm in their home opener.

"I feel like things just started clicking for us in the passing game tonight," Batavia coach Dennis Piron said. "He just needed to get a rhythm and get used to guys. We haven't gotten a good chance to get anybody together, so we're hoping that this will get it going."

With the win, Batavia heads into conference play with a 2-0 record for the first time since 2021, where they finished regular season play a perfect 9-0. And after having a ton of their new starters survive the likes of Glenbard West and South Elgin, Piron said it's a good feeling to have.

"We're playing teams that don't typically lose more than a couple games a year," Piron said. "And those new starters aren't new starters now after two weeks, so it's good that we're getting this experience heading into conference play."

Brown finished the game with five receptions, 110 receiving yards and two touchdowns, with his second score coming from 12 yards out at the end of the first half. It's just the second time that the senior has put up over 100 receiving yards and two touchdowns, with both coming in last season's state quarterfinal game against Hononegah.

"It felt great coming out here and doing what I need to do, like running my routes and going out and giving my everything every play," Brown said. "And it just all fell to where it was supposed to. And coming out here and translating it to the game felt great."

The Bulldogs managed to get on the board on fourth down on two separate occasions. Nathan Whitwell got Batavia's first points of the game after getting the ball on fourth-and-1 and running 61 yards for the score. He also added a 35-yard score in the second quarter and finished with 116 yards.

The second came at the start of the second quarter. With a fourth-and-4 situation on South Elgin's 15-yard line, Anderson found offensive and defensive lineman Gavin Pecor, who dove across the pylon for the score.

"There was a lot of trust to catch that for a big lineman," Anderson said. "But he enjoyed doing that a lot, so it was a great moment."

Brett Berggren also added a score in the game on a 52-yard punt return.

South Elgin got both its touchdowns in the second half. Ishmael George caught an 18-yard touchdown and Darrion Thurman had a 1-yard rushing touchdown against the Bulldogs' second team.
