Kane County Health Department releases 2024 Youth Voices Forum on Mental Health Report

The Kane County Health Department and the Kane County Regional Office of Education, as part of the Kane County System of Care for Children's Mental Health, organized the fifth annual Youth Voices Forum on Mental Health on Feb. 2.

The health department recently released a report detailing the event, which identified student-reported needs for mental health support and outlined action steps for young people, schools, parents, and the community.

School mental health professionals and community leaders gathered to hear from 80 students representing eight different high schools across Kane County.

The students shared their opinions on existing mental health services and what additional supports are needed. Participating schools included: Bartlett, Dundee-Crown, Elgin, Geneva, Larkin, South Elgin, Streamwood, and West Aurora high schools.

This year, the students identified the following key mental health needs:

- Enhanced accessibility to trauma-informed, culturally sensitive, and gender-affirming mental health resources in schools and the community, with a focus on the unique challenges faced by the Latinx community.
- Increased knowledge and understanding of mental health challenges among families and school staff to break the cycle of stigma surrounding help-seeking and conversations about mental health.
- Safe environments and relationships that provide opportunities to further develop social skills, healthy emotional vulnerability, and positive relationships.
- A desire to feel validated, supported, and seen by parents, caregivers, teachers, mental health staff, and peers.

"Young individuals have firsthand insight into their own mental health experiences and understand what works for them," said Michael Isaacson, executive director. "It's essential to listen to their voices to ensure the community offers services that truly meet their needs."

This was the fifth youth-focused event hosted by the Kane County System of Care since the Illinois Children's Healthcare Foundation awarded a seven-year, \$2.3 million grant to the Kane County Health Department in 2018.

- Rollingout Outrage in Elgin: Teacher allegedly calls 11-year-old girl racial slurs

The harassment led to bullying from other students

In a shocking incident that has ignited outrage and concern within the community, a parent has filed a federal civil rights lawsuit against a school district in Elgin, Ill, after her daughter was allegedly subjected to racial slurs by a teacher. The lawsuit, filed on Sept. 10, accuses the school district and a female math teacher of violating the civil rights of the 11-year-old girl, who was called the N-word and labeled as "mentally ill" during class.

The alleged incident took place on Sept. 12, 2023, just days into the new school year at Ellis Middle School. Amica Richardson, the mother of the girl, claims that the teacher confronted her daughter aggressively, using derogatory language that not only humiliated her but also set the stage for further bullying by classmates.

According to the lawsuit, the teacher reportedly asked the girl, "What should you be called? What should I address you as? The N-word or Black?" This confrontation left a lasting impact on the young student, who has an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) designed to support children with disabilities or special needs.

Legal Action and Allegations

Richardson's lawsuit includes six charges against the teacher and the Elgin School District, citing violations of the Equal Educational Opportunity Act and intentional infliction of emotional distress. The complaint highlights the severe emotional distress, mental anguish, and humiliation the girl has endured since the incident.

Richardson's attorney, Jack Casciato, emphasized the ripple effect of the teacher's alleged actions, stating that the harassment led to bullying from other students. "She was called the N-word, and it's been confirmed by six statements from other students in the class, leading to bullying because students see it as the right thing to do," he explained during a press conference.

Impact on the Victim

The emotional toll on Richardson's daughter has been profound. The young girl reportedly expressed a desire to distance herself from her racial identity, saying, "She just don't want to be Black anymore."

Despite the trauma, the girl continues to attend Ellis Middle School, but her mother has voiced concerns about her well-being and comfort in the educational environment. Richardson kept her daughter home for several weeks following the incident, and upon her return, the teacher involved was no longer present at the school. However, the Elgin School District has not confirmed whether the teacher was terminated, citing privacy laws.

School District's Response

The U-46 school district has refrained from commenting on the specifics of the lawsuit but issued a statement emphasizing their commitment to student welfare. "School district U-46 does not endorse or tolerate any use of epithets of any kind, nor does the school district endorse or tolerate any disparaging remarks or slurs. Our priority remains the well-being and education of our students," the statement read.

Community Reaction

The incident has sparked widespread outrage among parents and community members, who are calling for accountability and a thorough investigation into the school's handling of the situation. Many are rallying around Richardson and her daughter, advocating for a safe and supportive educational environment for all students, particularly those from marginalized backgrounds.

This case highlights the ongoing issues of racism and discrimination within educational institutions, raising critical questions about how schools address such serious allegations and protect their students. As the lawsuit unfolds, it serves as a reminder of the importance of fostering an inclusive and respectful atmosphere in schools, where every child can feel safe and valued.

South Elgin gets back on track, shuts out Larkin

South Elgin burst into the win column with a 56-0 thrashing of Larkin Friday night at Memorial Field in the teams' Upstate Eight Western Division opener.

The Storm ended all eight drives in the end zone.

"I was very excited for the players. They deserved it. They worked very hard for it," South Elgin coach Patrick Pistorio said.

Quarterbacks John Ginnan and Carter McDonald took turns guiding the offense for South Elgin. The duo, a senior and a sophomore, together completed seven of nine passes for a total of 133 yards. Ishmael George hauled in five of the tosses for 97 yards and two touchdowns.

"Both had played this season, and we wanted to give both of them a series or two tonight. They were amazing and I'm happy with both of their performances," Pistorio said.

Running back Darrion Thurman led the ground game, rushing for 106 yards on 15 carriers and crossed the goal line twice.

"He had a great game, running physical. I was excited to see him run between the tackles," the South Elgin coach said.

"We didn't execute," Larkin coach Vincent Ray said. ""We had a game plan. Offensively, we let some things up. Defensively, we gave somethings up."

George put South Elgin (1-2, 1-0) on the board at the 5:50 mark of the first quarter. The senior hauled in a 22-yard pass from John Ginnan (4 of 6 for 42 yards) in the right corner of the end zone.

South Elgin's Nicolas Barkho intercepted a pass by Royals QB Julius Yandell to set up South Elgin's second score at the 37-yard line. Brandon Berrios ended the drive with a 3-yard scamper with 47 seconds left in the first frame.

Thurman completed the Storm's third possession on a 3-yard run with 6:13 left in the second quarter. With 2:10 left until halftime, Carter McDonald (3 of 3 for 91 yards) connected with George for a 55-yard TD for a South Elgin 28-0 halftime lead.

The Storm wasted no time increasing their advantage in the third quarter. Berrios caught the opening kick off of the second half and returned it 85 yards for a touchdown.

"I muffed it, but I picked the ball up and my blockers led the way," Berrios said.

South Elgin's remaining three touchdowns all started with interceptions of Yandell passes.

"We won the turnover battle," Pistorio said. "That was very impressive."

Berrios wrestled away the ball from Larkin (0-3, 0-1) receiver Tizairian Johnson-Williams at the Royals' 31-yard line to set up the Storm's sixth score, Thurman's 1-yard plunge at the 9:59 mark of the third quarter.

Picks by Zacharia Barkho and Larry Smith also ended in Storm scores: a 1-yard run by Tyson Riley late in the third quarter and a 2-yard rush by Derek Thavisay in the fourth frame.

Elgin doesn't want Aaron Saldana to pass up scoring a goal. But sometimes, natural instincts kick in. 'A good start.'

Last season, Elgin's Aaron Saldana played in the offensive shadow of Eduardo Nava.

Even so, Saldana tallied 19 assists, helping Nava become one of the area's most prolific scorers with 36 goals. It stood to reason Saldana, a senior midfielder, would take over that role this year.

But he didn't see it going that way.

"I didn't think I was going to score a single goal this year," Saldana said. "I got off to a good start against Naperville Central. I got more confidence to go forward and try to score some more goals."

Saldana didn't add to his goal total Thursday night, but he got back to his facilitator role with a pair of assists for host Elgin during a 4-0 Upstate Eight Conference win over crosstown rival

Larkin.

Junior midfielder Danny Perez scored twice for Elgin (2-1-2, 1-0). Beto Gaytan, another key returnee, and Ian Diaz added goals. Ulises Flores made 13 saves in net for Larkin (2-2-3).

Saldana's goal helped the Maroons tie powerful Naperville Central in the season opener, giving coach Jimmy Romano an idea. Romano figured it was time to move Saldana up to take advantage of his playmaking ability, and it worked. Saldana scored three goals in Elgin's first four games.

Romano is pleased how a week of practice helped ease Saldana's transition up the field.

"We moved him up more to give him more scoring opportunities," Romano said. "He did that. He scored three goals so far this year and could probably have a couple more.

"He's very creative and able to do those things. We shifted him up this year to create those possibilities. He's doing very well."

It's a role Saldana admitted takes some getting used to, but he's looking like a natural so far.

"My role has changed because obviously we lost a lot of good players attacking-wise last year," Saldana said. "We still have the players to do it. My role is to try to create more chances.

"I feel like the chemistry is building every single game and we're scoring more goals."

The Maroons wasted little time Thursday jumping on Larkin.

Gaytan crossed a ball to Perez, who scored a minute into the game. With 20 minutes left in the first half, one of Saldana's five shots on goal was deflected to Perez to make it 2-0.

"He's a very talented, skillful player that is also versatile," Romano said of Perez. "He can play the holding mid, the attacking mid, striker, winger, but he's very creative and can finish.

"We want to put him in that role this year. He's another player like Aaron where we put him in this role this year different than last year."

Larkin, which graduated 14 seniors, is finding its way with an inexperienced roster.

With building blocks like Flores and dynamic midfielder Jonathan Garcia, however, coach Michael Huizar is excited about where things are headed for the Royals.

"A turnover led to a goal right away," Huizar said. "I'm proud of how we responded. I wish we were a little more consistent from the beginning. We're still figuring out how to get into the final third.

"Once that clicks, I think we'll show how dangerous we are. We have a lot up top. We just have to find them."

Elgin, meanwhile, has the most experience returning in Romano's time guiding the program. That has led to high expectations again after last season's sectional championship.

With Gaytan and Saldana leading the way, Romano is happy with how things are looking.

"This group is phenomenal," Romano said. "They want it. They want to get further than we did the past two years. They're hungry. They're a great group of guys. They're such close friends. They're like brothers."
